The recent birth of a son and heir the Duke of Norfolk was treated as an event of almost national importance. The Duke of Norfolk is a man of mark in many ways. He is the most important lay member of the Roman Church in Great Britain. He is also the premier peer of Great Britain, and the birth of a son insures the continuance in the direct male line of the ancient family of Howard or Hereward, which stands next to the blood royal at the head of the English peerage and traces its descent back to Saxon times.

Arundel Castle, the Duke's stately Sussex home, dates from the time of King Alfred, who mentioned it in his will. 




