Escape of a Noted Criminal.

Little did the spectators, who from far and near gathered into the old, loyal and historic town, Omeme, to witness the public execution of that notorious criminal, 'Guy Fawkes,' realize the bold attempt that was made to effect his escape from justice.

It seems the prisoner was in charge of Warden Peter Stinson, who placed him in Woodshed Co. Jail, and, as is the custom, placed a death watch over him.

When the Warden and Sheriff went to conduct him to scaffold the watch was found bound and gagged, and seemed under the influence of a strong drug. The strong iron bars were wrenched from the window, and all that remained of prisoner was a hat which in his hurried departure he had dropped.

The Warden at once gave the alarm. Special constables were sworn in, blood-hounds were secured, and soon a strong party were scouring the surrounding country. After a short search the renegade was found hiding near the G. T. R. tracks, where he was evidently waiting to board an out-going train, as travelling on foot was out of the question, he being in a very weak condition after long months of close confinement. He was immediately taken to the square and executed in the presence of thousands, more or less.

No blame is attached to the worthy warden in connection with the escape, on the contrary loud expressions of admiration is heard for the brilliant manner in which he organized and conducted the pursuit, and some of the citizens are seriously contemplating a very handsome remuneration for the official.

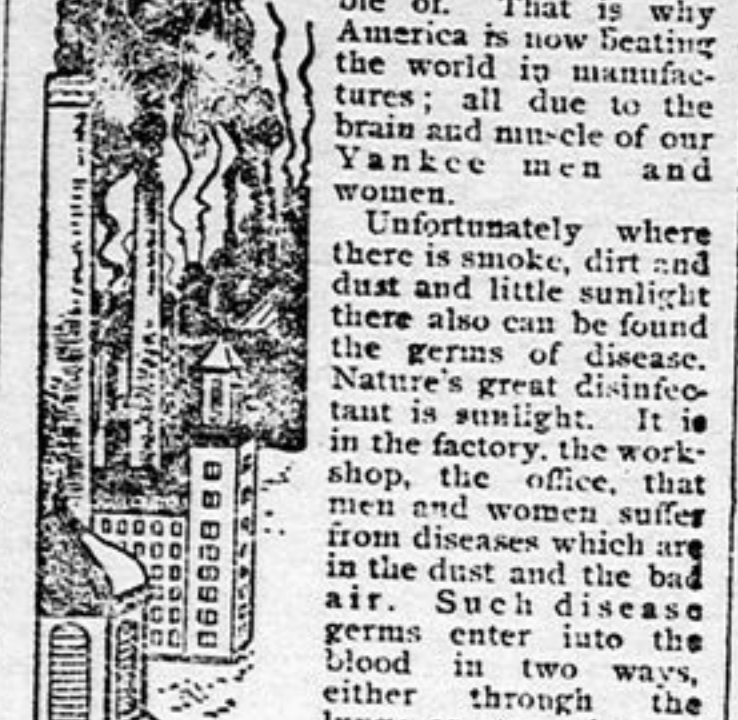
