At least five of the great Powers of Europe now possess more or less efficient dirigible war balloons, and these machines may play an important part in the next great conflict. France has La Patrie, the first and perhaps the most practical of all. Germany has the Parseval, the unnamed Gross balloon, and the Zeppelin airship. England has the Nulli Secundus, and both Austria and Haly have war dirigibles which really sail the air, though very little is known about them.



New System of Purifying Water Used

A new system of purifying water is being installed at Philadelphia. It is the application of nature's own method to the solution of the problem which vexes all great cities. It is known that running water purifies itself. The explanation is that running water becomes thoroughly aeraled, and the organic matter in the water is thus decomposed and consumed. The purifying agent in air is oxygen, especially in the form of ozone. The quantity of ozone in the atmosphere is limited, but it is greatest after a thunder storm or in high latitudes where there is much electricity in the air.

In Philadelphia electric discharges are passed through air confined in tubes, changing the oxygen to exone, The air is then driven into a column of water at its base. As it rises through the standpipe containing the water the ozone seizes upon bacteria and other organic matter, uniting to form carbonic acid gas, which bubbles to the top and escapes. 
