GEORGE DALES HUTCHINSON.

Born Nov. 18 1836. Died Dec. 19 1905. Deceased was born on the old homestead, South Monaghan, and there during the years of boyhood and early manhood he continued to reside, helping his parents in turning the forests into fruitful fields. Of a kind and obliging nature, he was ever ready to help a neighbor in sickness or distress and earned the good will and respect of a large circle of friends and acquaintances. He married Tamzenea Bestard, and to this union were born three sons and one daughter, viz., William on homestead; Miles, on the farm near Fraserville; Robert, west of Millbrook and Annie D., at home.
