Stinson's big stove and tin store, and spread so rapidly that none of his very large stock, valued at over four thousand dollars, could be saved Mr. Stinson had no insurance and it certainly is a serious blow to him. The fire spread so rapidly that the residence of Mrs. (Dr.) Norris, on the West side and Mr. George Griffin's tailor establishment on the East were also an easy prey to the flames. Also the Masonic Hall, with its valuable firmishings, was de [ stroyed. Mrs. Norris' loss amounts to about \$4,000, with \$1,000 insurance.
