Tuesday Evening, Jan. 5. Liverpool wheat futures closed today and to bid higher than yesterday, and corn futures unchanged to bid higher.

Toronto Dairy Market. Butter, separator, dairy, 0.25 to 0.30; Butter, store lots, 0.23 to 0.24; Butter, creamery, 0.27 to 0.28.

CATTLE MARKETS. Cables Unchanged—Hogs Active and Higher at Buffalo.

Toronto Live Stock. TORONTO, Jan. 5.—Receipts of live stock at the City Market were 191 carloads, consisting of 1540 cattle, 1297 hogs, 1290 sheep and lambs, with 45 calves.

Exporters. A very few export steers were on sale and these sold at \$3 to \$3.25; export bulls sold at from \$3.50 to \$4.25.

Butchers. Prime pack of hogs sold at \$4.80 to \$4.90, and we heard of a couple of choice hogs for which \$5 was bid early in the day.

Milkers and Springers. The supply of milkers and springers was quite equal to the demand, with prices easy at \$30 to \$32 each.

Sheep and Lambs. Receipts of sheep and lambs, nearly 1300. Prices were firm, as follows: Sheep \$2.25 to \$3.40 for ewes, and \$2.25 to \$2.75 for rams, lambs \$1.50 to \$6.50 per cwt.

Hogs. Mr. Harris reported selects at \$6.25, and lights at \$6 per cwt.

East Buffalo Cattle Market. EAST BUFFALO, Jan. 5.—Cattle—Steady, prime steers, \$6.75 to \$7.10.

New York Live Stock. NEW YORK, Jan. 5.—Receipts, 251, nothing doing; feeling weak, Liverpool and London cables quoted live cattle firmer, at 12c to 13c per lb. dressed weight; refrigerator beef lower, at 9c to 9 1/2c per lb.

Chicago Live Stock. CHICAGO, Jan. 5.—Cattle—Receipts, 5000; market steady, steers, \$4.50 to \$4.75; cows, \$3 to \$5.25; heifers, \$2.50 to \$4.00; bulls, \$2.12 to \$4.20; calves, \$2.50 to \$5.00; stockers and feeders, 2.50 to \$5.

Deal With Turkey. Berlin, Jan. 6.—The British Government, it is learned, has reached an understanding with the Turkish Government whereby the Sultan, as head of the Mohammedan faith shall use the influence of the priesthood in India to support the British rule there in return for active British diplomatic support in the Turkish controversy with European powers.

Welcomed Home. Ottawa, Jan. 6.—When William Hutchinson, commissioner of Dominion exhibitions returned to Ottawa yesterday after an absence of four years in Europe, he was formally welcomed by Mayor Hopewell on behalf of the city, and by Peter Whelan on behalf of the Board of Trade.

Victim of Loan Shark. Ottawa, Jan. 6.—The suicide of Hillman, draughtsman, who shot himself on Saturday, it is said was due to the fact that he had been unfortunate enough to get into the hands of a money shark.

Having borrowed money at usurious rate of interest, he was unable to pay and all his effects were seized, leaving his family in a condition of want.
