Tuesday Evening, Jan. 12. Liverpool wheat futures closed today 3/4 to 1/2 lower, and corn closed 1/4 to 1/2 lower than yesterday.

At Chicago, May wheat closed 1/2 lower than yesterday. May corn closed 1/2 lower, and May oats closed 1/2 higher.

CATTLE MARKETS. Cables Firm—Hogs Active and 15c to 20c Higher at Buffalo.

LONDON, Jan. 12.—London cables for cattle are steady, at 12c to 14c per lb., dressed weight; refrigerator beef is quoted at 9c to 9 1/2c per lb.

Toronto Live Stock. TORONTO, Jan. 12.—Receipts of live stock, as reported by the railways, were 84 cars, composed of 1455 cattle, 1278 hogs, 600 sheep and lambs with 40 calves.

Exporters. A limited number of exporters found ready sale, and more would have sold had they been offered. Steers sold from 5c to 5c 5/8.

Butchers. Prime picked lots of heifers and steers are worth \$4.80 to \$5; loads of good, \$4.40 to \$4.70.

Feeders and Stockers. H. & W. Murby report light deliveries, all of which were readily taken. The Messrs. Wilber bought 500 steers, \$30 to 35 lbs. each, at \$1.50 to \$1.70 per cwt.

Milk and Spinners. A moderate delivery of milkers and spinners sold from 8c to 9c each.

Calves. Receipts of veal calves were not large, and prices were firm at \$2 to \$7 per cwt, and one or two extra quality calves sold as high as \$7.50 per cwt.

Sheep and Lambs. The run of sheep and lambs was light, which caused prices to be strong. Sheep, ewes, sold at \$3.75 to \$4.25; rams, \$3 to \$3.50 per cwt.; lambs, \$5.50 to \$6.50 per cwt.

Hogs. Mr. Harris quoted selects at \$6.40, and \$6.15 f.o.b. cars to drovers at country points.

East Buffalo Cattle Market. EAST BUFFALO, Jan. 12.—Cattle—Receipts, 150 head; fairly active and steady; prime steers, \$6.50 to \$6.75.

Chicago Live Stock. CHICAGO, Jan. 12.—Cattle—Receipts, 5000; market steady; steers, \$4.50 to \$7.50; cows, \$3 to \$5.50; heifers, \$3 to \$5.75; bulls, \$3 to \$5.80; calves, \$1.50 to \$10; stockers and feeders, \$2.50 to \$5.15.
