CONSECRATION OF HIS EMINENCE ARCHBISHOP McEVAY AT ST. MICHAEL'S CATHEDRAL WAS GREAT SPECTACLE

Papal Ablegate Conducted Ceremony With the Impressive Ritual of Roman Catholic Church—Clergy Take Oath of Fealty-Great Gathering of Church Dignitaries-Apostolic Delegates Celebrate Mass.

(Special to Free Press.) don, as the Archbishop of Toronto in succession to his Grace Archbishop O'Conner, was the occasion of a brilliant and impressive ceremony in St. Michael's Cathedral yesterday morning. The event was distinguished by the presence of his Excellency the Papal Ablegate, the Most Rev. Donatius Sbarretti, Archbishop of Ephesus. and by many of the leading priests of the Roman Catholic Church in Ontario. The notable gathering was augmented by scores of clerical representatives from different dioceses, apart from those of the Archdiocese of To-

counted in scores, the laity were numbered by hundreds.

Headed by acolytes, carrying book, candle and censor, and followed by the priests of the diocese, and the visiting and diocesan priests, the archbishop's procession passed from the palace along Shuter and Bond streets to the main entrance of the cathedral. The short route was closely lined with many hundred spectators, but the greatest order was maintained without any interference from the small squad of police on duty, and the stately procession passed along without any difficulty. Following the diocesan clergy came a long array of high dignitaries of the church, and bishops of other dioceses, not only in the province of Ontario, but from far down by the sounding sea, who delighted to do honor by their presence to the new archbishop. Escorted by a bodyguard of the Knights of St. John, in their quaint uniform, and with drawn swords, Archbishop McEvay, clothed from head to foot in golden raiment, with his crosier in his hand, came immediately after. The visiting bishops and the procession closed with another small body of the priesthood.

At the entrance to the cathedral his grace was received by Vicar-General McCann, and, after sprinkling holy water upon the people and blessing the incense, proceeded up the aisle to the sanctuary, where he knelt in prayer. He then proceeded to the altar, and read the prayer to St. Michael. After his grace had returned to the pre dieu, the vicar-general ascended the pulpit and read the papal brief transferring him from London to Toronto. The archbishop was then escorted to the throne by Archbishop Gauthier of Kingston and Bishop

Dowling of Hamilton. Addresses were presented by both clergy and laity to which the archbishop replied and the clergy of the Toronto diocese took the oath of fealty to their new diocesan.

First in the procession came Father McGrand, the cross-bearer, holding aloft the richly ornamented gold cross After him came the acolytes, followed by the Christian Brothers and the priests, about two hundred in number. In front of the new Archbishop walked Bishop Macdonald, of Alexandria; Bishop McCarthy, of Hamilton; Bishop O'Connor, of Peterboro; Bishop Scollard, of Sault Ste. Marie; Bishop Dowling, of Hamilton, and Archbishop Gauthier, of Kingston. Lastly came Archbishop McEvay. He was robed in dark yellow garments, elaborately decorated, and in his hand he carried a crozier, while a large yellow mitre surmounted his head. Before entering the sanctuary he turned aside to bow to his mother, Mrs. Bryan Mc Evay, two brothers and other relatives, who occupied the front pew. As the Archbishop knelt at the altar and kissed the relics, the vast as semblage knelt in prayer.


