Verulam Council Transact Business

CONFERENCE WITH A COMMITTEE FROM THE COUNTY COUNCIL. Council met on Monday in Bobcaygeon, and in the temporary absence of the Reeve, Mr. W. Hetherington, was moved to the chair. The usual batch of correspondence was presented. Consideration was given to the levy of rates, and the only controllable one, the township rate, was, on motion of Messrs. Green and Mitchell, placed at three mills. John J. Thurston wished to know if the Council would fence the gravel pit they had from him, or convey it back to him. On motion of Green and Brooks, it was decided to transfer the pit to Mr. Thurston, provided he agreed to fence the pit and sold gravel to the municipality at same rate as charged for it at other parts of the township. A committee of the County Council, Dr. Mason, Warden, J. R. McNeillie, Clerk, T. Watson, Taylor Parkin, who had been met by Mr. Tiers, addressed the Council as to an amicable settlement of the proportion of cost of maintenance re Emily Creek bridge, and also the costs already incurred by the township. The Warden spoke briefly, and Mr. McNeillie concisely stated the opinion of affairs. While this was now a county bridge, recent legislation allowed the two municipalities to agree as to cost of maintenance. Mr. Watson proposed that if Verulam would assume the maintenance of the approaches or solid structure, the county would build a new bridge with cement abutments and assume cost of the structural portion for all time. The committee supported this proposal and left it with the Council, as they had to catch the train. Mr. McNeillie paid \$75, the share of the county stone crusher, Verulam having purchased a stone crusher of its own. On motion of Messrs. Mitchell and Hetherington, it was decided that the Council do not feel justified in accepting the County proposition re Emily bridge, and will stand by the judgment. Hetherington, Green, — That John Flett be appointed collector. Mitchell, Tiers,—That J. B. Kennedy be appointed collector. Mr. Brooks, as chairman, declared Flett appointed. Mitchell, Tiers,—That the salary of the collector be \$55. The by-law was passed accordingly. Mr. Hetherington made a statement as to the cost of setting up crusher. He had received \$30.72, and paid out \$29.63, leaving a balance of \$1.09 in favor of the municipality. Mr. Brooks explained that he over-run his commission about \$45, and would like a special for that amount. The crusher took more than he expected, and he had so many path-masters over-running the amount appropriated, many had exceeded from \$1 to \$7.
