Will Ratify Treaty. London, Dec. 30.—(C.A.P. Cable.)—The Times' Paris correspondent says there is every reason to believe that Mr. Fielding will succeed in obtaining the ratification of the Franco-Canadian treaty, and points out if Germany also obtains the advantage of the Canadian middle tariff the value of the British preference will almost disappear.

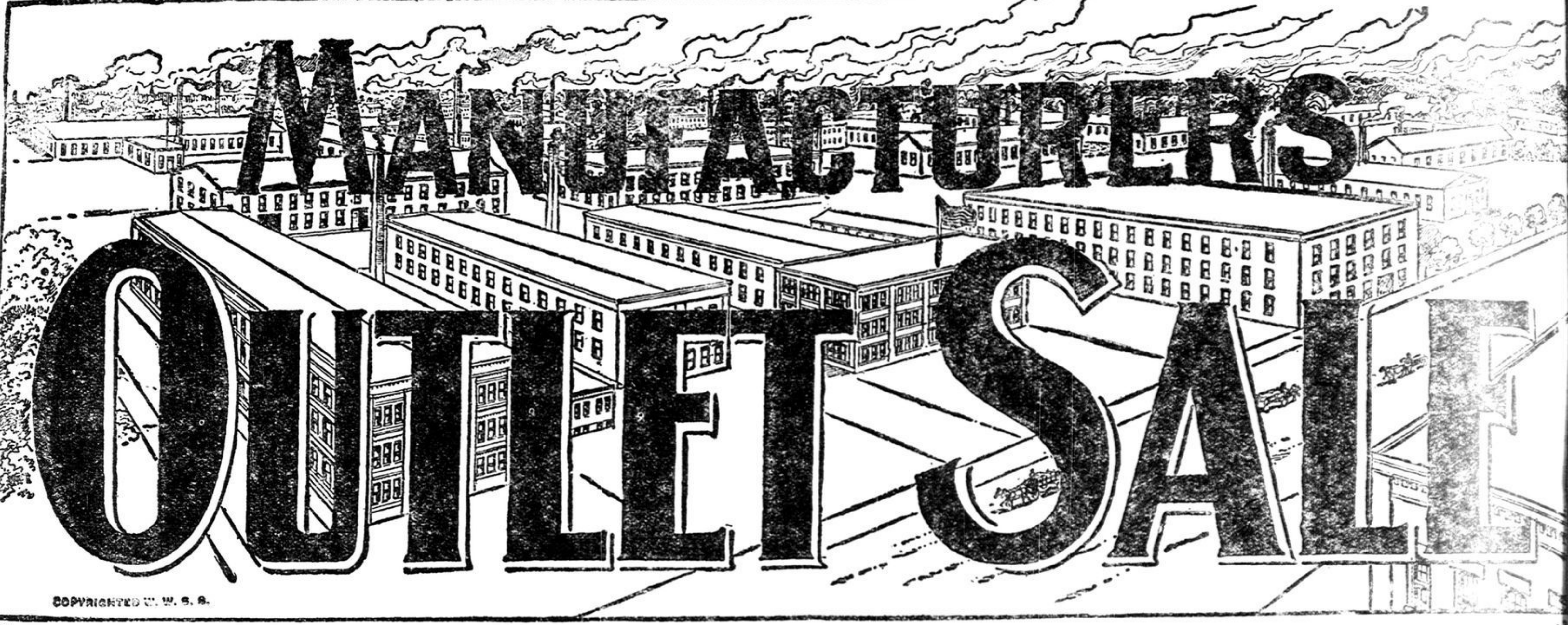
