NEWSY LETTER FROM LE PAS, MANITOBA FROM FORMER GLENARM RESIDENT

The Post is in receipt of the following very interesting letter received by Mrs. Donald Spence from her son, W. A. Spence, formerly of Glenarm, but at present on a government survey in the neighborhood of Le Pas, Man.

Dear Mother, I am sitting up as close as possible to the stove in our silk tent, and devoting about half of my time to shoving in wood; most of our spare time here is profitably spent in keeping on a fire. Today, however, it is fairly warm, not being more than about 20 degrees below zero.

fur trader an easy winner. Both were of that class of men who have been practically all over the world, and between facts and fiction they draw no lines.

We were due to change at Hudson's Bay Junction at about 3 a. m. but our train was about 4 hours late, so that we did not have to turn out till 7 a. m. when we arrived at Hudson Bay Junction. We were due to leave here at 8.30 a. m. so we sauntered up town and had breakfast.

At last we pulled out for Le Pas, what the real estate men call the Winnipeg of the north. In due time we arrived at the famous Le Pas. It is about the size of Cambary, only very much scattered, and as there are no hotels I had to hunt up a boarding house. This, however, was not very difficult, and as there are several restaurants, I soon had a full stomach, and felt prepared to face

their 30 mile trip to camp. There are

several small stores, and every third building is a pool room, which is nightly filled with Indians, half breeds and foreigners of all kinds, as well as native Canadians. This glorious townsite, which is being sold frenziedly over in England and down east, is surrounded on three sides by muskeg and tamarack swamp. On the north side flows the Saskatchewan River. So fine indeed are its prospects that lots on the main street are worth \$260 per foot frontage and upwards.

I arrived in Le Pas on Thursday night and Friday I spent looking for information concerning Surveyor Berry; I had difficulty in getting anything definite for some time, but at last a man pointed to a couple of dog teams racing by and told me that they belonged to Mr. Berry.

The next morning before sunrise we hitched up our ten dogs and started out to the north and east across the Saskatchewan. The old thermometer showed some 40 odd degrees below and I had some difficulty to keep my face from freezing but managed it somehow. The trail was heavy, and as we had big loads the going was slow. In the afternoon we had to cache a lot of our stuff in order to make camp that night.

The first part of our trail was along the grading of the railway but the last and largest part of it was through spruce and tamarack swamp. It was only the width of a toboggan, and the snow on each side was 3 or 4 feet deep. About two miles from camp we crossed an open bog, and the trail was completely drifted in, so that one of the drivers went ahead to break trail for the dogs.

At last I was well thawed out and crawled into my sleeping bag, thoroughly tired and not caring in the least that it was 40 degrees below. I have now been at work a week and while the weather is cold, we manage to keep fairly comfortable. Our cook is a good one and that covers a multitude of sins.

ANNUAL SESSION DOMINION ALLIANCE LINDSAY SHOULD SEND DELEGATION

The annual convention of the Ontario branch of the Dominion Alliance is called to meet in Massey Hall, Toronto, on Wednesday and Thursday, Feb. 26th and 27th. The convention call issued by the executive states:

"With gratitude to Almighty God for the encouraging success that has attended our efforts in the year that has closed, and appreciation of the cordial co-operation of moral reformers, regardless of creed or party, which contributed so effectively to the splendid victories won and the substantial advance gained, the executive committee issues this call. Even larger opportunities are before us, and another year calls every friend of humanity to greater activity and more strenuous effort."

"Every church congregation in Ontario, every Temperance Society, every body of citizens desirous of freeing our land from the evils of intemperance is earnestly requested to appoint delegates to this gathering, which is now recognized as Ontario's Provincial Parliament of Temperance Workers. It unites all denominations and classes and agencies for consultation, decision and action. It represents and voices public opinion. It speaks with influence and authority. It lays down the principles and out-

lines the plans which govern organized temperance effort in this province. "The present Provincial situation calls for more earnest thought and wise decision. Our position is stronger than ever before. Of the 835 municipalities, 488 are now dry. Of the 347 still under license, 125 have given a majority for Local Prohibition. The extension of our educational propaganda by the development of our field day work has been most encouraging, and the fact that both political parties have declared for an advance in temperance legislation means that we are on the eve of still greater things. The present Provincial situation is fraught with great possibility and grave responsibility. Never was there a time when it was more necessary for temperance workers to use their consecrated common sense, and to frankly and fearlessly, yet wisely and carefully, formulate plans for the impending struggle."

It is important that a representative delegation of temperance workers from Lindsay should attend the convention, as the deliberations will deal with matters bearing on the situation that exists in this municipality as a result of the recent local option vote.
