the work of the year now closing. Seven meetings have been held during the year, with an average attendance of 8 members per meeting.

As recorded in the minutes of our last annual gathering, the question of securing a shelter was considered, but no definite action was planned for and so the year has passed on to a close. The need of a shelter is very great at present, and cases that might be dealt with in a satisfactory manner, are allowed to go unattended until a more serious phase of the deplorable circumstances again come to light, as has been the case in many instances in the past.

During the year certain families have been visited and warned to look. after their children in a better manner. A man addicted to the use of strong drink, who has had full charge of his young son, the mother being dead, has been warned by our Solicitor that unless there be immediate and marked improvements in his, the father's, habits, the Children's Aid Society will take steps to sccure the guardianship of the child:
