Napoleon had said of China that she was asleep, and to let her sleep. She is now waking up, and when she wakes up will be a great menace to the world unless the christian religion gets hold of her and makes its civilization and benignant influence felt. It had been truly said that it would play the christian nations of the world to pay the entire expense of christianizing China. We have laid our hand to the work, and we dare not let go or draw back. The society needs more men and money, to accomplish this work.

**AT ST. ANDREW'S**

At St. Andrew's last night Rev. Mr. Wallace took his text from Matthew 10 and 27, "What I tell you in darkness, that shall speak ye in light. What ye hear in the ear, that preach ye on the house-tops."

Mr. Wallace said Jesus taught as was customary in his day, stopping often on his way to give his wise thoughts to his followers, who treasured them up in their memories. He taught men a broader, richer and fuller understanding of the scriptures. He obeyed these laws, not because they were the law, but because He approved of them. Because it was in the bible did not mean to Him that it was right, but He did it because He felt it to be right. It matters not who wrote the Scriptures, but we should approve them because they contain all that is right and just and good. "Love your neighbor as yourself," is the law by which we should be governed in our lives.

Christ used to take His disciples aside into the quiet wilderness to reflect on His truths. So must we come apart from the world for a time in order to be built up in our faith, but we cannot become hermits, for we must also rub up against the world. The man who has no moment to himself for communion with God is not complete. He lacks something. He loses a great force. Jesus dealt all our cares and wrongs. Never sleeping, He always hears our needs. If we are to be followers of Christ we must be sensitive as Christ as to the needs and requirements of those around us.

Jesus prepared in seclusion and quiet the work he has to do in the open. He does the work entrusted to him by his Father. He reveals to us the relation man bears to the work of life and communion with the Father. We must learn before we can teach, and we must add to our capital daily. This communion is essential, Christ did not neglect it and the servant is not above his master. To the ordinary man it must seem that the christian is impractical in spending time apart, yet it

**ENGLISH MEASURES.**

The following is taken from a recent London, England, despatch:

If a bill which passed its first reading in the house of commons this afternoon becomes a law, juvenile lovers of the cigaret will have (a hard time indulging their appetite. The act is a government measure, which amends the existing laws for the protection of children. It prohibits smoking under the age of 16 provides penalties for anyone less than 16 years old caught smoking in the streets or other public places, and makes the sale of cigarettes to any person under the age of 16 a punishable offence.

Among other interesting features, the bill establishes juvenile courts throughout the country and calls for special places of detention for children, instead of sending them to the ordinary prisons. It proposes furthermore that the imprisonment of children be entirely abolished.

An effort is to be made to end the terrible waste of infant life; through drunken parents rolling on their children in bed. The returns show that 1,600 infants perish annually from this cause, and in the future parents will be punished for such deaths. Burnings are responsible for an almost equal number of infant deaths, and penalties are provided for parents who leave children alone in rooms with unguarded fires.

**MINISTER SALARIES**

Toronto News: The Bishop of Niagara has again raised the question of clergymen's stipends, a subject which has long vexed various branches of the church. There is real virtue in preaching for a small salary to people who cannot afford a better one, but no virtue at all in "preaching cheap" to a prosperous congregation. The view put forward by the Chicago Interior is that, while it is sometimes the minister's duty to be self-sacrificing, it is not the layman's duty to furnish him with the occasion of grace. The business of the layman is "to pay up and trust the Lord" to find some other way of developing the virtue of altruism in the preacher. The beautiful
