Has Been Transferred to that Parish by Archbishop Gauthier

Rev. Father Collins, for the past two years curate of St. Mary's church, has been transferred by His Grace Archbishop Gauthier, of the archdiocese of Kingston, to the parish of Gananoque, to fill a similar position under Rev. Father Keough, the rector of the parish.

Some days ago The Post was informed that important changes would take place in the archdiocese as a result of the death of the late venerated Rev. Father Twomey of Belleville, and that Rev. Father Collins, who had been loaned to the diocese of Peterboro by His Grace the Archbishop, would be called to fill a position of importance.

The news of Rev. Father Collins' departure, it is needless to say, was received with genuine regret, not only by the people of St. Mary's parish, but by the citizens generally.

As a pulpit orator Rev. Father Collins possesses a wealth of diction and his sermons at St. Mary's church were literary gems, deeply impressive, fervent, and marked by originality and simplicity.

In his departure from town the Catholic Literary Society suffers a loss. He was the soul of the organization, and worked indefatigably in its behalf.

Tale of an Indian and Two Lindsay Boys

How They Got Mixed Up with an Aboriginal Jag and a Charge of Theft

The Peterboro Examiner says an Indian and two Lindsay youths arrived in Peterboro on the nine o'clock train from Lindsay Friday evening, and before they had spent many hours there, they were safe in the custody of the police.

The Indian carried an immense bottle of whiskey with him and as a result of imbibing too freely of the fire water, came very nearly losing his hard earned wages which he was bringing home to Rosemeath from the lumber camps of the Huntsville Lumber Company.

He pleaded guilty to being drunk in a public place Friday night, but was allowed to go with a warning and told to get out of town. Charges of attempting to steal \$25.70 from him were preferred against the Lindsayites, but after hearing the evidence of the Indian and P. C. Newhall, His Worship dismissed the accused, stating that while in his own mind he believed that they had intended to rob him, yet it had not been proven.

The gold watch and locket found in the right hand overcoat pocket of one of the Lindsay youths was retained by the police despite the protests of his counsel.

On the locket were the initials P. J. G., and it is believed that he is not the rightful owner of the time-piece nor the locket. A photograph of a young girl inside the locket was identified by a local lady as her cousin. She told Chiel Roszel Saturday that the initials were those of a gentleman cousin of hers.

Whether or not the watch was found unlawfully is not known, but it is the intention of the police to make an investigation.
