

> A reactionary storm period is ceneral on the 24th, 25th and 26th-coincident with the centre of the Venus. period. The probabilities are that a prolonged spell of hard stormy weather will merge storm periods at this time, but storms will be more pronounced and general on the reactionary days-24th, 25th and 26th. It is reasonably probable that snow blockades will equal or exceed anything of the whole winter, during the last half of March, and notably on the dates of regular and reactionary storm periods. We do not say that such results are certain to appear, but no reader of this almanac need be surprised if they do. The combined :-fluences of Jupiter and Venus, and Earth's Vernal Equinox, will almost certainly spring some kind of phenomenal excess upon us.

A regular storm period covers the

last three days of March, and the first three days of April. The Mercury equinox is added to those of Vulcan, Venus, Earth and Jupiter at this time, so that it is reasonably sure that March will be rough and stormy to the end.
