FARM NOTES.

HOW TO PREPARE LIME WASH.

As the season for spraying is rapidly approaching, we find many of our growers dreading the work of applying the lime-sulphur wash.

A fire place can be built of bricks, so that the boiler plate will rest on brick-work. Leave open at end and put in two or three lengths of stove pipe.

When the lime begins to slack, stir occasionally. Boil for one or two hours, or until the mixture turns a greenish color.
