

Guelph, April 10. - The death took place this morning of Rev. Canon Baker, a retired member of the Anglican clergy, who for some years past has resided with his son at Courock, a few miles from the city. Auto Rules

Toronto, April 7 .- Mr. Sutherland's automobile bill to regulate the speed and operation of motor vehicles on highways was reported by the Municipal Committee of the Legisla-ure Tuesday morning. The features of the bill are; No person shall for hire, pay or gain, drive a motor vehicle on public street or highway unless he is licensed so to do, and no person shall employ any one to drive a motor vehicle who is not so licensed licenses are to be issued by the I'rovincial Secretary's Department. No person under the age of seventeen years shall drive a motor vehicle. If an automobile meets a horse or horses going in the opposite direction and if the horses appear, frightened, or if signalled so to do, the driver shall stop the motor, vehicle, including the motor, and shall remain stationary so long as may be necessary to allow such rider or driver to pass or until directed to proceed, and in case any animal appears to be frightened the operator, and any occupants of the motor vehicle shall render assistance to the driver of the animal. On meeting a funearl procession outside the limits of a city the driver of a motor vehicle is to stop, and where practicable turn into an intersecting street, road or line until the funeral possession has passed. Provision is made for persons sustaining loss or injury upon giving noitce in writing.

Agressive Work Will Begin at Once--Much Money Being Spent.

Still another contract on the Trent Canal has been let. This time it is cause of its embarrassment, Liew off Section 3, Ontario Rice Lack division, the successful tenderer being the Canadian Development Construction Company of Montreal. The important part of this section is Chisholm'st Rapids, situated about five miles west of Sterling and six and a half milest

from Frankfort. The work to be done includes a lock and a dam, a half mile of rock excavation, enlarging of the present oldda m, and dredging both up and down the Trent river. The latter portion of the work consists of from three to four miles of river.

The amount of money involved in this contract is estimated at \$325.5
