English General Sounds Tocsin and Welcomes Canadian Navy

In an address to the Empire Cub of Toronto, Major-General C. W. Robinson, of Ealing, London, England, said it was absolutely necessary for Canada to have command of the Great

Canada was destined to be a great naval power, he said, and he was glad that a nucleus of a Canadian navy had been laid. He spoke particularly of the Rush-Bagot Treaty, and said that if the United States violated any of the terms of the treaty, Canada was entitled to take the same action. So far as Canada was concerned, it could not sustain its territorial supremacy so long as the power to the south had the opportunity of placing vessels on comed the formation of a Canadian extensive breeding of high-class navy.
