HON. A. G. MACKAY RETURNED

Huron, Centre-Huron, South-Whitney Government Has Enormous Majority - Minister of Agriculture Defeated-Tories Had Some Unexpected Losses - Studholme Again Stands Alone In the Legislature - Pense Loses.

Toronto. June 9.-Nothing like Premier Whitney's triumph was ever conceived of in Ontario before. Hon. Oliver Mowat's biggest majority was 32. Hon, J. Sandfield Macdonald was satisfied with 16. Premier Whitney is sustained by a majority which at the time of writing, looks like 71. "I haven't much to say to-night," said the Premier about 10 o'clock, when nearly all the returns were in, "except that the result is beyond my expectations. I had hoped, with good reason as I thought, to have our old majority. The result shows considerably more than that, and I am very thankful to the people for their endorsation."
