WITH THE SOLDIER BOYS AT BARRIEFIELD COMMONS

Notes From Post's War Correspondent

Barriefield, June 19th. Friday was a quiet but busy day at Barriefield camp, as final touches were being made before the arrival of Gen Sir John French and his staff. The camp presented a very charming picture early in the afternoon with the 2,500 men mustered upon the grounds...

General Sir John French and General Sir Percy Lake, inspector-general of Canadian Forces, and staff, arrived in the city at midnight Friday, and went directly to the Frontenac Hotel. At nine o'clock this morning the distinguished general went over to Barriefield to inspect the camp. The trip over was made in two large automobiles owned by Kingston gentleman.

The manoeuvres took up the best part of the forenoon from 9.30 till near twelve o'clock. The general was greatly pleased with the appearance of things and with the way the men went through the manoeuvres. After the inspection was over General French and staff had luncheon at the camp and were driven to the city, leaving for the west at 12.25 o'clock, where he will inspect the different camps, the next stop being Niagara.

The inspection this morning drew a large number of civilians and all were surprised with the way the men worked.

Following in the afternoon drill which was carried on from 2.30 to 3.30, a rest was given the tired boys until 4.30, when a turnout was made for three-quarters of an hour.

General French was welcomed and escorted on his leaving by the massed bands.

night did not only make the 45th Reg. the largest in camp, but the best equipped.

On Sunday an excursion is expected to be run by the 45th Reg to Viacent Point on the American side, and by all appearances a good crowd is expected.

The army service corps and staff officers were on horseback from 10 o'clock until 2 in the afternoon. In the morning a sham battle was fought in which all the men took part. Yesterday afternoon the men were again out in full force. The manoeuvres brought the men down to the bridge, across into Dead Man's Bay and several miles down the Gananogue road. A large number of the soldiers fell victims to the heat.

In the past two days twenty five men have been brought to the army medical corps suffering from heat prostration. Nine or ten cases have been taken to the station hospital. They are reported to be progressing favorably. White skirmishing yesterday morning a private of the 40th Brigade stumbled and seriously injured his knee.

The following is a conservative estimate of the food consumed in a day: 412 lbs each of butter, sugar, jam and beans; 1236 lbs vegetables; 206 lbs lbs of cheese, split peas and salt and about 40 lbs of tea. These provisions are provided by the permanent service corps through its capable Quartermaster Sergeant, Harrison, formerly of Halifax, now stationed here.

Kitchener Anecdotes.

During the South African War Lord Kitchener, who has returned to England after eight years' work abroad, entrusted a certain captain with an important commission. Unfortunately, the captain's horse cast a shoe. Hence a disastrous delay. "Very sorry," was the general's sarcastic comment, "but I cannot rest my plan of campaign on a horse's shoe or an officer's carelessness." Thus it is that "K. of K." impresses upon his officers the futility of excuses and the necessity of being prepared for anything and everything. No man, it is said, has a greater faculty of estimating a man's capabilities at a glance. But he made a mistake on one occasion.

It was during the Boer War, at Vrededorp Road Station, that he started fitting out extempore mounted infantry columns. He determined to equip and send them into the field at once. He went to the waiting-room to look for officers, and found a single man in occupation. He was smart and well-dressed, and pleased Lord K's critical eye. "You will command a corps of mounted infantry I have just raised," said the general. "Very good, sir. What will my duties be?" "Don't you know your duties?" "My own, yes, sir." "Then don't argue. What is your regiment?" "Blanchshires, sir." "What rank?" "Master tailor, sir." Kitchener hurriedly left.

King Edward's Reign. King Edward VII. has reigned longer than Edward V., Richard III., Edward VI., Mary I., James II., Mary II. and William IV., and he will this year have reigned as long as Henry V. Although his reign has been a short one, the only sovereigns since the conquest who have lived longer than he were Queen Elizabeth, George II., George III., William IV. and Queen Victoria.—London Mail.

Greater Berlin. Plans for a "greater Berlin" have been worked out as the result of a prize competition among leading architects, builders and town planners. Prizes of \$8,000 each have been awarded for schemes which peer three generations into the future and contemplate the Berlin that will be in the year 2000, which is fixed as the period when the capital will team with a population of 10,000,000. Meantime it is estimated that trade and traffic will have tripled by 1920 and that the population will then be 4,300,000, or double the present total. In 1950 the total will reach 6,450,000, and in 1975 it will aggregate 8,250,000. "In a population of 10,000,000," say the professors who captured the second prize, "we divine a great peril for Berlin, a peril for which we must be prepared." It is proposed to avert this danger by a plan to regulate the construction of street buildings and parks so carefully that overcrowding will practically be impossible.

African Animals For the Southwest. Captain Fritz Duquesne, native of the Transvaal, secret service officer of the Boer government, African hunter, naturalist, author and lecturer, proposes to introduce in the southern and southwestern part of the United States some of the most useful animals of the African rivers and deserts. He declares that many of them would flourish in our climate and become a very valuable addition to our fauna. He says they would produce leather, meat and other commercial articles in great quantities from regions which now are almost unproductive. The proposal has met with favor in influential circles in Washington.—Success Magazine.
