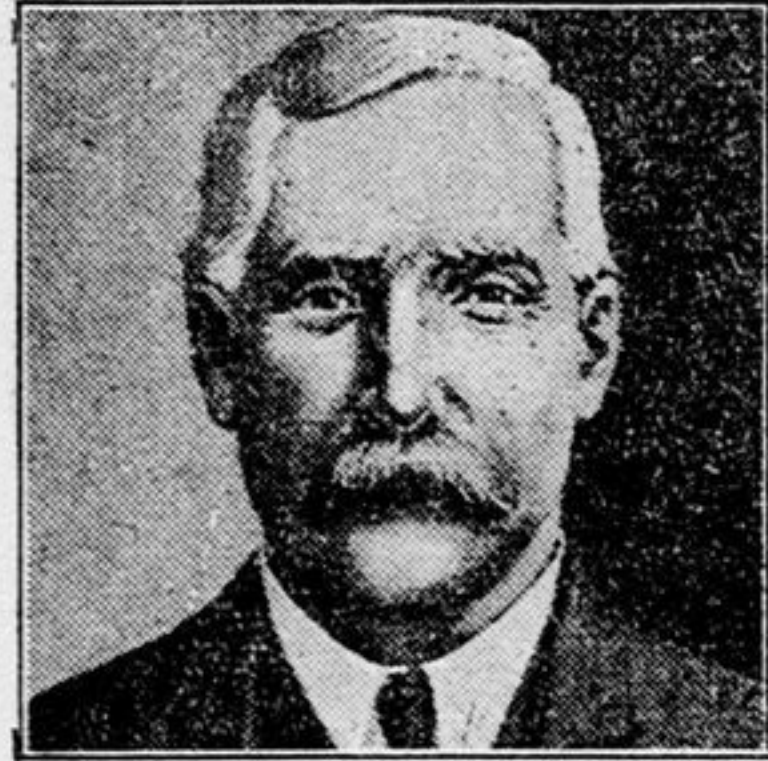
LINDSAY AND THE POWER QUESTION
