Offence Against Criminal Code

of Citizens, by Singing etc. On the Streets.

At an early hour this morning bus load of young people returning from a function held in the country disturbed the peaceful slumbers many of our citizens when driving through our streets. Their choruses, while rendered in excellent harmony, would have been most pleasant to the ear on any other occasion.

This may appear perfectly harmless to those who indulge in this practice, but it is a violation of section 238 of the Criminal Code, which the Post has been requested to publish. The clause says in part. "Everyone is a loose, idle or disorderly person or vagrant who causes a disturbance in or near any street, road highway or public place by screaming, swearing or singing, or by being drunk or by impeding or incommoding peaceable passengers. Every loose, fdle or disorderly person or vagrant is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars or to imprisonment without hard labor for any term not exceedin six months."


