Oranges Grow in Town of Lindsay

There are not many people in this town who would believe that real oranges would grow in Lindsay, and if you were to tell some that you had an orange tree that was bearing real oranges they would be inclined to think that you were joking, or qualifying for the dippy house.

Mr. E. E. Sparling, who resides at the corner of Colborne and St. Paul's, has, however, a fine orange tree which has, all told, about ten oranges on it. He has it growing right in the centre of the garden and it is growing just as fast as any of the other trees. Mr. Sparling, before coming to town lived out in North Dakota, and when he moved to this country he thought he would bring some southern tree and see if it would grow in this climate. While in New York he purchased an orange sprout and brought it along with him. On account of it being out of the ground so long, however, it wilted away, but as soon as a young slip grew up, a branch of the old tree. Mr. and Mrs. Sparling cared for the young tree, and, as Mrs. Sparling is a lover of nature, the plant was carefully nursed. To-day they have a nice orange bush with a quantity of fruit on it. A reporter was shown two of the oranges and he found it easy to imagine he was in the Southern fruit belt. A curious thing about this orange tree is that it blooms, has green fruit and has ripe fruit all at the same time. The plant blooms seven or eight times a year, and therefore a large quantity of fruit would be gathered off one tree. For the winter the plant sits on the window sill and basks in the sunshine.

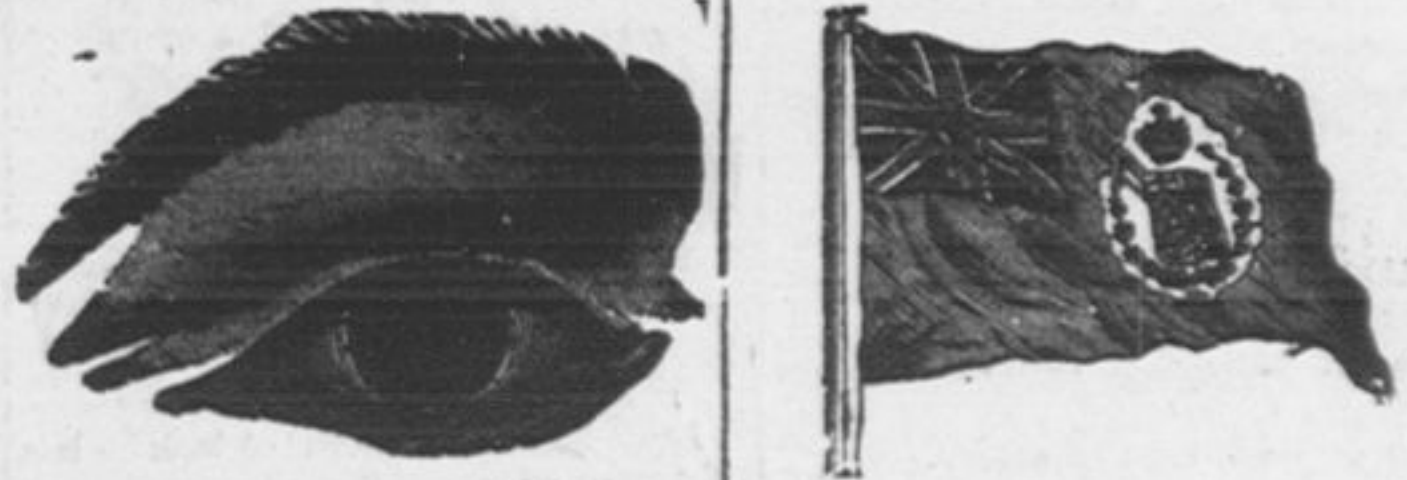

August Was Chilly Weather Analysis

Mean Temperature was One Degree Less than Last Month

"August is as much warmer than March as Asia is better than Africa," says a Russian proverb, but citizens of Lindsay who have spent the last week at near-by summer resorts, or who have stayed in town and put another blanket on the bed, don't consider that any compliments are coming the way of August on its warmth.

Certainly it has felt recently as if August hasn't been lingering in the lap of 99 in the shade, but the prevailing fact is that this month is a little warmer than the average of the first two dozen days of August in past years.

The mean temperature for the first 24 days of August of 59 years is 64.3, whereas the mean temperature of the present month's first 24 days is 67.2.

Another way of looking at it is that although the mean temperature of the first 15 days of this month was two degrees above average the mean temperature of the nine days ending today is 2.5 below average. Nearly every day recent has been below average.

And so it appears that recent days have been comparatively chilly and certainly they have felt that after the warmer than usual days of the first part of the month.

This month's rainfall to date is 2.18 inches, or just about as much as the average for the whole month of August.

This fine cool weather according to the latest weather dope is to stay with us till to-morrow, when there's a chance of it being a little warmer.
