1880—February 5-15th. 1883—May, 22-31st. 1883—September, 6-30th. There were twenty-one prisoners in the gaol at one time for a few days, during the year 1878. During this year there were one hundred commitments, these being two ministers among them.

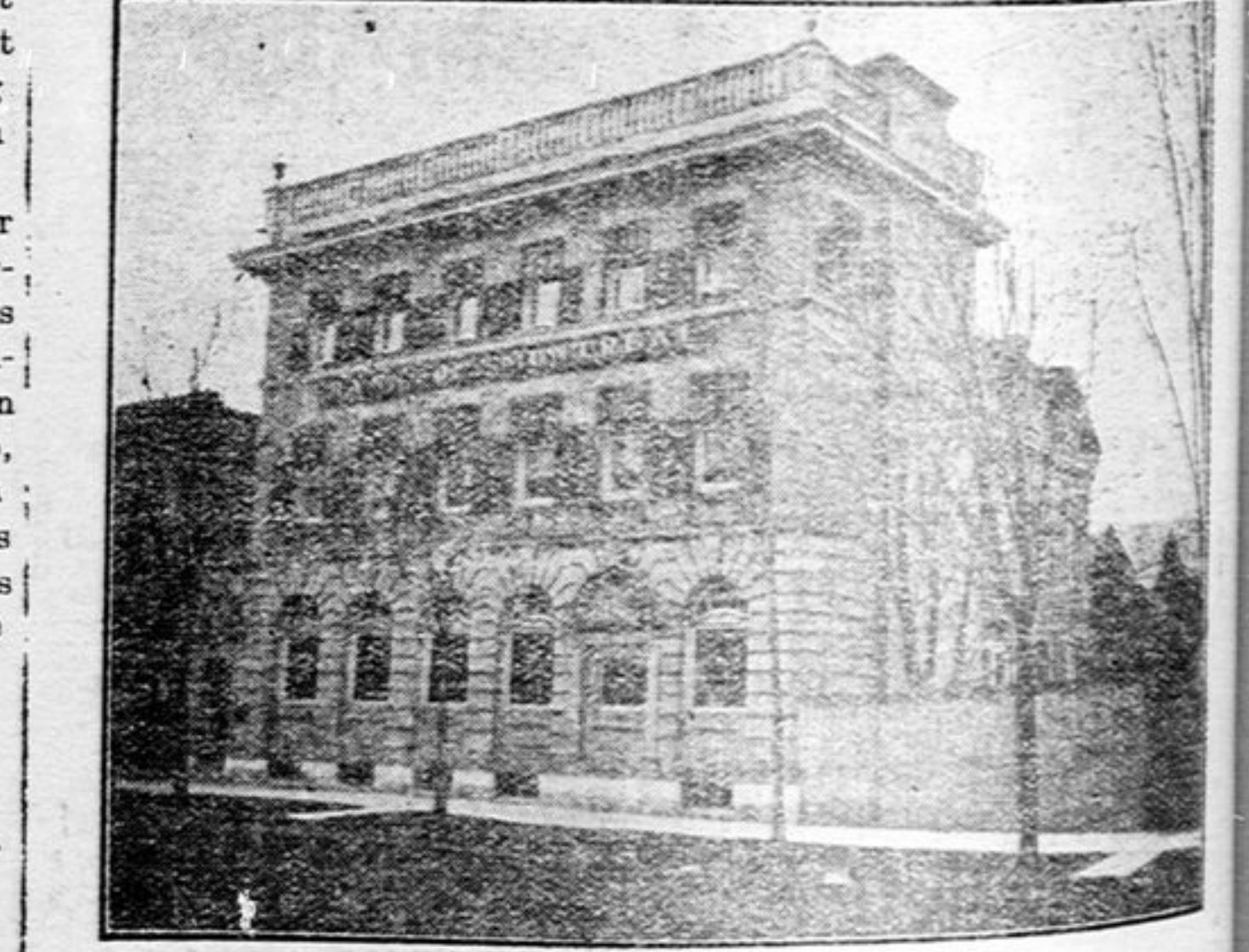
