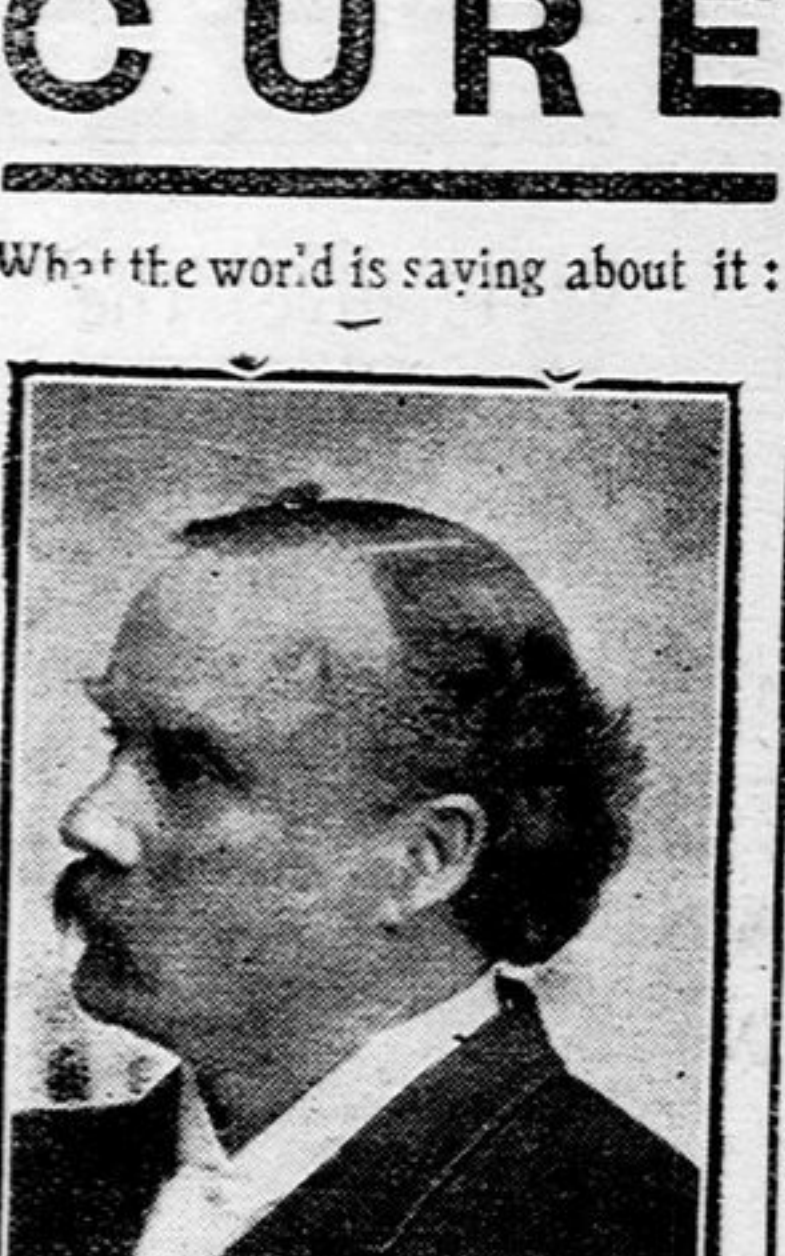
GREAT GROWTH SHOWN IN I. O. O. F. GRAND LODGE MET AT NIAGARA FALLS

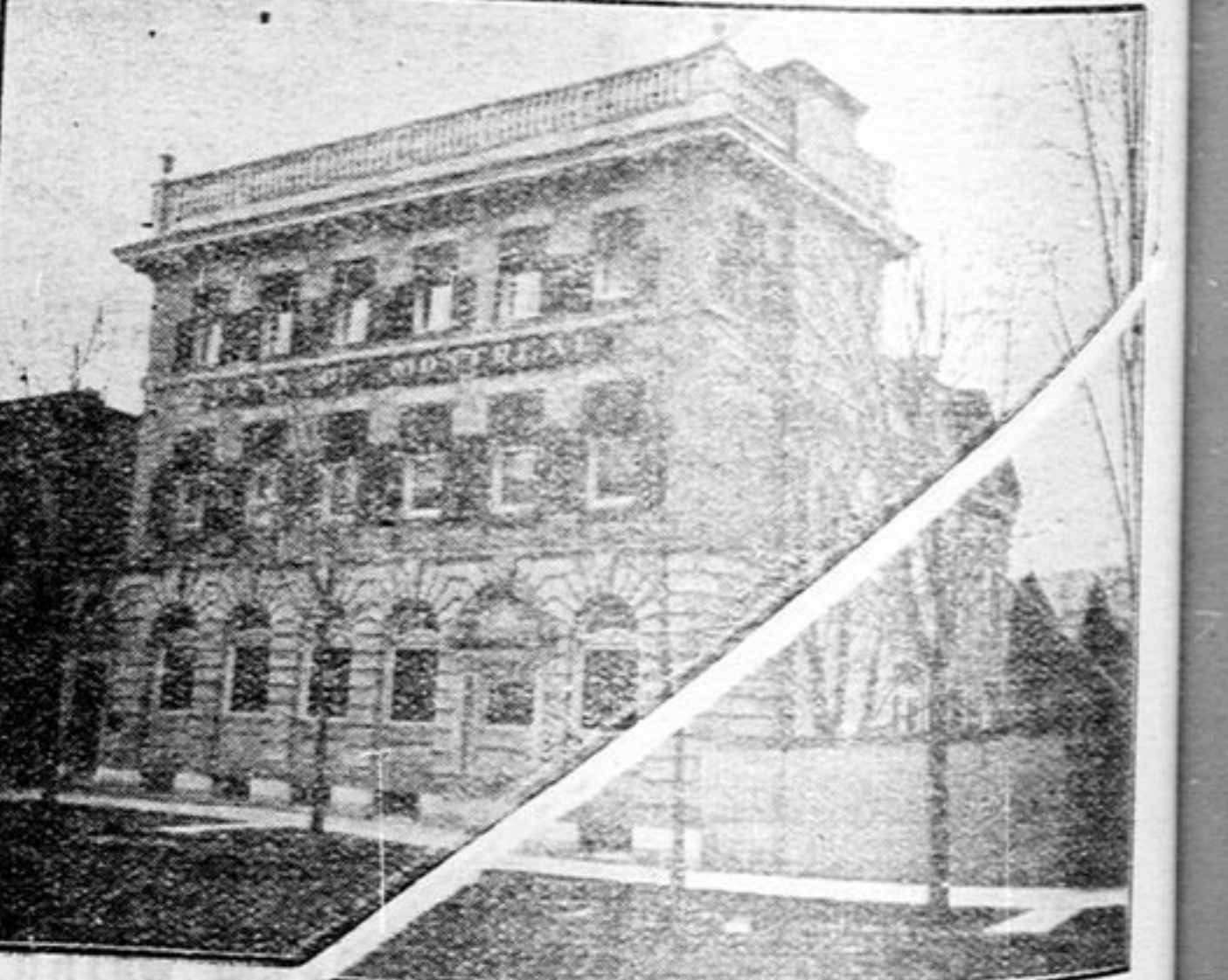
