ENGINEERS HAVE DIFFICULTIES "You will realize" said one of the engineers, "the difficulties we have to overcome when I tell you that the new track will eventually be a double one and will shorten the distance between Toronto and Montreal, while it will also possess the great advantage of having an easier grade. About 5,000 men are already engaged on the whole line at various points and as soon as the right-of-way is acquired at any particular section, the work of construction is pushed on."
