



Three Months' Jail for Nettleton

The Young Detroit Knife Artist Will Do Time far His Rashness

At last Thursday session of the county police court the Detroit youth Nettleton, who was found guilty of stabbing two Fenelon Falls youths, John Barry and Samuel Nicholls on Aug 31st, came up for sentence before Mr. F. D. Moore, K. C., county magistrate.

County Crown Attorney Mr. A. P. Devlin, looked after the interests of the crown.

Mr. F. A. McDiarmid, in addressing the magistrate, asked that His Worship take into consideration the provocation the accused labored under when the crime was committed. He might have acted differently than using his knife, which practice must be deprecated, but the conditions prevailing at the time of the struggle should, he thought, be considered. That the Fenelon youths got no more than was coming to them was the general opinion. He felt that the time the accused had already spent in jail should satisfy justice. The accused had no money to pay a fine, He wa a stranger and a mere youth and he asked the count to exercise leniency and commit the youth to the county

jail for a short time. His Worship, before passing sentence, stated that he could hardly. credit the statement that the accused was only fifteen years of age. To his mind the appeared to be fully two years older. He carefully reviewed the evidence of the prisoner concerning the fight, and stated that his actions during the struggle showed coolness and deliberation. His attack on Barry was inexcusable. He could not treat the offence; as a light matter. The knife came dangerously near penetrating a vital spot and causing death. It wan not a bayish freak by any means. It was not his function to reform criminals but to warn others. The fact that this was the prisoner's first offence would receive consideraview of the case. The accused had Many Guesses tion, and he would take a lenient been ably represented by his counzel, and he hoped he would realize the enormity of the offence. The people of Canada will not tolerate. the use of the knife, and in this instance it had been used deliberately. Whatever customs may prevail in prisoner's country, regarding the use of the kuife, His Worship remarked it would not be tolerated here. There was little necessity of his giving a moral lecture, and he would there, fore sentence him to three months in the county jail at hard labor, his senterce to date from August 31sti last. Nettleton took his sentence quite coolly, and seemed to realize the fact that his sentence was a light one somewhat lighter, probably, than he had expected.



The Toronto and Nipissing Eastern Extension Railway was incorporated by the Ontario Legislature in 1880, with power to construct a railway from a point on the Georgian Bay to Ottawa. In 1884 the name of the company was changed to the Irondale Bancroft and Ottawa Railway, and its powers have been confirmed and extended from time to time. By one statute is was provided that the terminus of the line should be at Rens frew, and one of the subsidy grants sell, of Wilmington, Delaware, and line from Bird's Creek, the present terminus, easterly, either by the I B. and O. Railway or by the Toronto, Lindsay and Pembroke Railway, By an act of the Ontario Legislature passed in 1907 the payment of the subsidy for the eastern extension of the line was extended to 1910. The line extends from I. B. and O. Junction on the G. T. R. line to Haliburton, vin Irondale to Baptiste, near Bancroft, 50 miles.

Cigarette Law Strict Regulations

Constables Should Confiscate them. When in Possession of Those Under Sixteen

Chief Vincent desires to call the attention of merchants selling tobacco and cigarettes, as well as parents and guardians to an act to restrain the use of tobacco by young persons.

The penalty for furn'shing tobacco to persons under the age of 16 years is a fine not exceeding ten dollars for the first offence, not exceeding twenty-five dollars for a second offence and not exceeding one hundred. dollars for a third offence.

It is the duty of any constable toseize any cigarettes, cigarette papers or tobacco in any other form than cigarettes in the possession of any person under sixteen years whom he finds smoking or chewing, tobacco or about to make or chew tobacco in any street or public place.

Everyone is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction in the case of a first offence to betreprimanded, in the case of a second offcuce to a penalty not exceeding one dollar and in the case of a third or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding four dollars, who beng under the age of 16 years, smokes or chews tobacco on a street or public place, or purchases or has in his possession, whether for his own use or not, any cigarettes, cigarette paper or purchases or has in his bossession for his own use tobacco in any other form than cigarettes, and it shall be the duty of the justice to examine upon oath or affirmation all persons brought before him who are found guilty of violating this section and a refusal to give information as to where tobacco was obtained, shall be deemed a contempt of court.
