NOMINATIONS MADE

Canadian Politicians Have Busy Day of Joint Meetings.

ONLY TWO ACCLAMATIONS

W. F. Maclean and Hon. L. P. Brodeur Will Go In Without Contest—Ald. Fiset Opposes Sir Wilfrid in Quebec East, Otherwise Ottawa Candidature Would Have Been Invalidated—Busy Day.

Toronto, Oct. 20.—There was only one election by acclamation in Ontario. W. F. Maclean, the former Conservative member for South York.

In five other constituencies no Liberal appeared. Two Conservatives are opposed to each other in Frontenac, and two Liberals in a similar position in Prescott. Against Major Beattie, the former Conservative member for London, there is running J. W. McCandless, a labor man. Apparently the only election by acclamation in Quebec was in Rouville, where no opponent to Hon. L. P. Brodeur, Minister of Marine and Fisheries, appeared, and he, also, is sure of his seat in the next Parliament. It was expected that Sir Wilfrid Laurier would have no opponent in Quebec East, but an acclamation for the Prime Minister would have seriously interfered with the plan of campaign and the appearance of Ald. Fiset as competitor was a surprise to most people.

If Sir Wilfrid had been elected in Quebec East it would have invalidated his candidature in Ottawa City, as the law provides that no man who is already a member of Parliament can be a candidate for another seat.
