REVISION OF THE VULGATE.

Abbot Gaspuet, president of the English Benedictines, has arrived in Rome to undertake the revision of the vulgate, or St. Jerome's Latini version of the bible. This matter has been entrusted to the Benedictines by the Vatican.

The Abbot had a long private audience with the Pope on the matter in hand. The Pope realized the vastness of the undertaking, and has authorized the Abbot to associate with himself whatever scholars he would like. The researches are to be carried out in all parts of the world. The Abbot will select his assistants next week. He is not restricted to Cathelies in his selection. The Pope ensists that the work be done in the most scientific way to convince Catholics as well as non-Catholics that this is a genuine attempt to discover the true basis of the text of St. Jerome. 


