MACADAM FOR RESIDENTIAL STREETS

There is a very common impression among the general masses of the people that macadamized roadways are all very well for country highways, but that for town streets, a paving material is necessary.

One place in which macadam can be rightly employed is in paving certain town and city streets, those of a residential character, not subjected to traffic so great as to render the maintenance of macadam excessively expensive.

A new section of law in regard to maintenance of public health officers was explained, whereby the district has to provide for a portion of the expense of his travel and business.
