The engineer in charge of the work shall be privileged to name the order in which the Contractor shall proceed with the work and at any time, during the progress of the work, order a temporary delay of the work, or any part thereof, and the Contractor shall be bound thereby.

The whole of the work of said No. 2 A drain is subject to the engineer's approval or rejection and must be completed in every particular, notwithstanding anything shown on plan, profile or specification to the satisfaction of the engineer in charge of the work, and in case of any dispute arising through anything not shewn, or inaccurately shewn or expressed in accompanying specifications, then in such case the decision of the engineer in charge of the work shall be final and the Contractor shall be bound thereby.

The engineer in charge of the work shall issue monthly certificate in favor of Contractor to the amount of seventy-five per cent. of the estimated value of work performed.

AND WHEREAS the said Council are of opinion that the above mentioned drainage work described in the said Report is desirable for the purpose of preventing damage to the lands aforesaid and for the purpose of making an improved outlet for the several and respective drains above mentioned.

THEREFORE the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Mariposa pursuant to the provisions of The Municipal Drainage Act enacts as follows:-

1st. THAT part of the said report, plans, specifications, assessments and estimates above and hereinafter specifically set forth are hereby adopted and the drainage work as therein indicated and set forth shall be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. THE Reeve of the said Township of Mariposa may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Mariposa the sum of \$9821.00, being the said Municipality's proportion of the funds necessary for the work and may issue Lebentures of the Corporation to that amount in sums of not less than Fifty Dollars each and payable within ten years from the date of the said Debentures with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say:-The said Debentur?s may be issued principal and interest combined in ten equal annual instalments of \$1271.86 each or may be issued with coupons attached for the payment of interest, and the said Debentures and coupons, if any, shall be payable at the Bank of Montreal at the Village of Oakwood, in the County of Victoria.

3rd. FOR paying the sum of Sixteen Hundred and Sixty Dollars \$1660.00), the amount charged against the said lands and roads for benefit and the sum of Seven Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty-one Dollars (\$7661.00), the amount charged against the said lands and roads for Outlet Liability apart from the lands or roads belonging to or controlled by the Municipality and for covering interest thereon for ten years at the rate of five per centum per annum the following total special rates over and above all other rates shall be assessed, levied and collected (in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied and collected) and upon and from the under mentioned lots and parts of lots and roads and the amount of the said total special rates and interest against each lot or part or lot respectively shall be divided into ten equal parts and one such part shall be assessed, levied and collected as aforesaid in each year for Ten years after the final passing
