Our Catholic people are often told that local option is only a "Protestant invention," whereas the Catholic province of Quebec might be called the home and cradle of local option, there being more municipalities under local option in that Province than in Ontario, and many of these provinces were under prohibition and were kept under it by the strenuous efforts of the parish priests. In most of the cities, and particularly in Montreal, the clergy, following the lead of Archbishop Bruchesi were doing all they could to obtain at least a substantial reduction in the number of licenses.

Another parish priest who was not in favor of the law, speaking to Father Ryan about the contention that local option caused a loss of trade, said that he knew a case where that for people soon went back to their abandoned market.

The parish priest of Orillia (at present in Barrie) told Father Ryan that while he was personally opposed to local option, or any other similar law, he had to admit that it worked satisfactorily in Orillia.
