EAST SIMCOE LICENSE DISTRICT.

Resolution Passed by the Board of Commissioners at their Weeting In Orillia, December 24, 1903.

Whereas numerous complaints have been made that the law is being violated in this district in so far as selling during prohibited hours is concerned, and

Whereas the inspector reports that some of the bar-rooms in his jurisdiction are so placed and so constructed as to hinder a proper inspection of said bar-rooms thus facilitating the illegal sale of liquor during prohibited hours, and Whereas there is a diversity of opinion among licensees as to the regulations in regard to the form and proper situation of bar-rooms, and in order to bring about a proper understanding in this regard and to facili-

tate proper inspection and stop as far as possible the evils herein set forth; Be it therefore resolved and ordered "That all bar-rooms in this the license district of East Simcoe shall be placed in the front of the hotel tavern, inn or other building where intoxicating liquors are licensed to be

That the windows of such bar rooms shall face the public street and be of no less size than five feet six inches in height, and two feet six inch s wide, the bottom panes of such window or windows to be not more than five feet six inches from the

That all bar-rooms shall be unbroken by partition, curtain, screen, recess or other osbtruction whatsoever and shall consist of one room only. That no room of any kind shall be placed between the bar-room and the window or windows of such bar-room opening on the public stret.

That not more than three doors shall open into or out of such bar-rooms and such doors shall be unbroken in any way by slide, trap or pigeon hol That such doors shall not open in-

to or out of any place of room other than the public hall of such hotel, tavern, inn, alehouse or beerhouse or into the public street or yard of such hotel, tayern, inn, alchouse or beer-

That the window or windows in such bar-rooms shall have all blinds hung from the top of such windows said blindst o be no longer than sufa declaration that they are not en- ficient to cover the upper half of such window or windows.

That all of such window or windows shall be of clear, transparent and uncolored glass, not frosted or ground, and such that all parts of the interior of such bar-room can readily be seen from the public street. That this resolution shall go into effect on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and four.

## A HUGH ENGINEERING WORK.

Such is the Irrigation Project of the C. P. R. Near Calgary. Winnipeg Free Press. Mr. J. S.

Dennis, engineer in charge of the C. P. R. irrigation work in Alberta, argived in the city yesterday from Montreal en route to Calgary. Mr. Dennis went east to confer with the general officials of the company concerning the irrigation scheme, the survey? of which were completed decided to call for tenders at once for the construction of the main canal which will be thirty-five miles long, gixty feet. wide at the bottom, and will hold water to the depth of ten foot. This canal will carry the water to supply the scondary canal. which will be, when ultimately completed, one hundred and lifteen miles long. To make the main canal 250,000,000 cubic feet of earth will have to be removed and the work will have to be done by power plants such as steam shovels, railways, etc. The project is the largest of its kind on this continent and is designed to make useful for generall agriculture land now lying waste owing to the cures are radica! and permanent. lack of moisture, the region being subject to cycles of extreme drought. Of the tract to be reclaimed it is estimated that 1,500,000 will be rendered fit for growing cereals of all kinds, the balance to be devoted to grazing and the cultivation of grasscs.
