Whitby Beet Sugar Factory. Mr. P. C. Graham, former editor of the Port Perry Standard, was in town Saturday in the interests of The Keystone Beet Sugar Company, Limited, the authorized capital of which is \$400,000. A grand location for the factory has been secured at the lake harbor, and the machinery from Wiarton factory-which failed owing to the land being unsuitable for beet growing-will be removed to Whitby in the spring, so that the factory may be ready to handle the fall supply of beets. The product of 500G acres will be required to keep the factory running at its fullest capacity, and 2500 acres have already been secured.
