DEADLOCK REACHED
The Allies Reject the Proposals of Venezuela.

FRENCH PRESSING CLAIMS.
Demand Made For Equality of Treatment—France Insistent Upon Her Rights—Events Constructed in a Warlike Fashion Are Misleading—What It All Means—A New Proposition Stated.

BEHAVIOR OF FRANCE—France by arbitration has secured rights in Venezuela which Germany, Great Britain and Italy are bound to respect. Never has the feeling of friendship between France and the United States been so strong as now.

Propositions involving a compromise of the allied powers' contentions for preferential treatment in the settlement of their claims against Venezuela have been submitted to the Governments of Great Britain, Germany and Italy by their representatives here. It provides that for a short period, perhaps six months or a year, Great Britain, Germany and Italy shall receive exclusively 80 per cent. of the customs receipts of the ports of Puerto Cabello and La Guayra, and at the end of the period that all the claimant nations be placed upon the same footing.

Robinson of St. Thomas made application that Judge Bell be restrained from passing sentence on Robert Pester, Henry Branton and William Walsh, all of St. Thomas, recently found guilty by him for perjury and illegal practices in connection with the referendum vote in that place. It is claimed that Judge Bell, being of Kent County, had no jurisdiction in Elgin County, and that the whole procedure was wrong.

NO ARBITRATION.
But Senate Committee Have Reported the Alaskan Boundary Bill—Secretary May Is Caunt.

Washington, Feb. 2.—At the next executive session of the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations will make a favorable report on the Alaskan boundary treaty. The committee Saturday by a unanimous vote decided that this action should be taken. There is no time limit as to the ratification of the convention, but Secretary May has sought to avoid the inclusion of any matter that would make the treaty objectionable, and he has stated that he will not be forced to "arbitration." When the draft of the convention was first prepared it contained both in the preamble and the body the words "arbitral tribunal." The word "arbitral" was stricken out of the articles before the convention was signed, and was inadvertently left in the preamble.

TURN OF THE C. N. R.
Several Passengers Injured in Accident Saturday.
COACHES INTO THE DITCH.
Bridge Foreman Marvin Keenan Received Severe Internal Injuries Besides Other Ailments—Passengers Were Lightly Clad, Although 20 Below Zero Was Registered at Time of the Accident—The Injured.

Winnipeg, Feb. 2.—Spreading rails caused a bad smashup Saturday afternoon on the Canadian Northern Railway, near Maroband, a station forty-eight miles east of Winnipeg, on the Fort Arthur line, and it seems a miracle that no fatalities resulted, although several passengers were badly shaken up and cut by flying glass.
Marvin Keenan, foreman of the C. N. R. bridge building department, sustained severe internal injuries, besides being badly cut about the head and having his leg broken.

VERDICT AGAINST AULD.
Train Despatcher Blamed For Charles Warning's Death at Merritt—Electric Signals Necessary on Road.
St. Catharines, Feb. 2.—The inquest touching the death of Charles Warning, who was killed in the collision on the Merritt station and the tunnel under the Welland Canal on January 3, was continued at the Merritt Town Hall Saturday afternoon by Coroner Dr. Goodman of this city.
The train despatcher, John Auld, was not present, as he left the locality a few days after the accident, after having first called for his pay, and his whereabouts are at this time unknown.
The two engineers, Desault and Duke, have not yet recovered from their injuries and were unable to attend to testify, but the jury concluded that they had facts before them sufficient to enable them to arrive at a verdict.
The verdict was to the effect that Charles Warning came to his death through the negligence of the train despatcher, John Auld. It was further found that the Grand Trunk tunnel to give electric signals at the Merritt station, and until the line is double tracked between Merritt and Niagara Falls.

RAILWAY STRIKE CALLED OFF.
Employees of the Dutch Roads Go Back to Work.
Amsterdam, Feb. 2.—After a meeting Saturday night of the leaders of the unions it was decided to call off the railroad strike. Work was resumed at 6 o'clock yesterday morning.

CANADIAN FRESH MEAT.
War Office Wants Supplies For Army in South Africa.
London, Feb. 2.—The British War Office has decided to invite tenders from Canadian farmers for the supply of fresh meat to the British army in South Africa.

News From Ottawa.
Ottawa, Feb. 2.—The customs revenue of the Dominion for the month of January was \$2,726,249, an increase of \$397,063 over the same month last year. The revenue for the seven months was \$20,752,865, an increase of \$2,598,987 over the same time in 1907, which was the highest on record.
J. Bruce Walker of The Brantford Exporter has been appointed emigration agent at Glasgow, Scotland, in the place of Mr. Murray, who has resigned.

TWO OVER ONE HUNDRED DIE.
Passing of a Servant 74 Years With One Family.
London, Feb. 2.—Mrs. Elizabeth Alop of Goswell Common, Guildford died Saturday, aged 102. She was born in Swallow street, London. For seventy-four years she was with the family of the late Mr. Audrey Riddale, a relative of Lady Audrey Buller. She received the late Duchess of Teck's prize for the female servant who had served in one family for the longest period.
Lived in Canada Once.

Tacoma, Wash., Feb. 2.—Mrs. Marguerite Allen, the oldest woman in the State of Washington, died at the home of her daughter in this city Saturday, aged 104 years. Mrs. Allen was born in Scotland and emigrated to Canada more than seventy years ago, moving later to Ohio. She leaves a son in Tacoma.
