NOT THE COLDEST WINTER
LINDSAY'S METEOROLOGICAL EXPERT PROVES THIS BY FIGURES.

Mr. Thos. Beall Looks Up Old Records and Gives Results.
On one of his usual jaunts around town our representative called last Wednesday morning on Mr. Thomas Beall, who takes meteorological observations for the Dominion Government, and was given some interesting information concerning the weather conditions of the past three months and those of previous years.

"Yes, we have heard a great deal about the present winter being a severe one and no doubt it has been," remarked Mr. Beall, "but we have had winters in which the weather has been much colder, and more snow has fallen. The fact is that for several years past—yes, since 1893—the winters have been comparatively mild; there only being a few real cold days, leads people to remark that because the cold weather has been more steady, it's the severest winter on record. To prove that this is not true, I might give a few facts confirming my statement.

CRUSHED BY ROLLING SAWLOG
Sad Fate of an East Peterboro County Shantyman.
On Thursday evening Feb 2nd a shantyman named Edward McFadden, whose home is in Digby township, was badly crushed by a rolling sawlog in a lumber camp on the border of Peterboro County. The unfortunate fellow was helping to load some heavy logs onto a sleigh when the end of one not solidly in place slewed round, knocked him down and passed over his body from the waist to the head, crushing him badly but not fatally. The injured man was conveyed to Gooderham—a 30 mile ride—where Dr. Sutton gave him every attention. Finding that his patient manifested symptoms of having contracted pneumonia as a result of exposure on his long trip from camp, the Dr. decided to remove him to the Ross Hospital, and set out with him Wednesday afternoon. The trip over the I.R. & O. Railway to Frontville Junction was made on time, but owing to the blockade on the Hamilton branch the doctor and his patient did not reach Lindsay till 1 o'clock Thursday morning, when a hack was secured and the injured man transferred to the Hospital, where he is doing well. Dr. Sutton is still in attendance, his train having left for the south about his arrival.

These industries will bring wealth to the country. Why, the greater part of the population of Canada will be west of Lake Superior within the next fifty years, and I predict that the rural districts will be lighted by electricity, the rivers will be ploughed by steamboats, tramways will be used to carry grain from the threshing machine to the elevator, and steam ploughs will be used on the prairie.
