CLOSING PROCEEDINGS OF THE JANUARY SESSION.

Gentlemen, I beg to call your attention to the duties resting upon you, and to appoint a committee to negotiate a settlement with the Boards of Education of the Town of Lindsay and the Village of Oshawa, respecting the maintenance of County pupils at the schools under the control of the respective boards.

The present is the last year of the term of ten years in which the valuation adopted in the year 1897 can be used as a basis for the equalized value of the County, and I beg to suggest that early steps be taken for securing a re-valuation, in the event of the Council deciding that a similar method should be adopted.

The late Judge occupied the position from the year 1874, and had thus served the County for a period of thirty-one years.

It has fallen to but few other men to whom have been entrusted the balance of justice, and to hold so evenly, and yet command so fully the confidence of all whose interests were affected by his decisions.

He valued the respect of his fellow citizens, and apart from his eminent position as a jurist, his high personal character, and the native kindness which was manifested in his association with the people of the County earned their highest regard, and has made his name known and honored and esteemed.

We respectfully tender our heartfelt sympathy to the bereaved wife and family of our deceased friend.

That leave be given for the introduction of a by-law under the provisions of the Assessment Act, section 56, for taking the valuation of the Township of Emily, Mariposa and Ops, between the first day of February and the fifteenth day of February, and in the town of Lindsay between the first day of February and the fifteenth day of May.

2. That the Clerk be instructed to support, on behalf of the Council, the application of Lieut.-Col. James Deacon to the Government of the Province of Ontario, in order that the salaries of retired civil servants who may be entitled to a gratuity or other recognition of their services.

3. That the communications from the Mayor and Clerk of the Town of Lindsay, respecting the House of Refuge sewer be referred to the Board of Management.

4. That no grant be made to the Lindsay Law Association.

5. That the sum of one hundred and forty dollars and eleven cents be granted to the Township of Mariposa, in consideration of the expense involved by reason of the outbreak of smallpox. The statement submitted shows that the cost was \$86.28.

6. That the sum of fifty dollars be granted to the National Tuberculosis Association for the support of the Hospital for Consumptives.

7. That Col. Sam Hughes, M. P., Hon. John Dobson and Hon. Geo. McArthur be requested to represent the Canadian Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis, to be held in Ottawa.

8. That the application from R. Rogers, esq., President of the Cambridge Public Library, be filed, the grant having been made under resolution of Council.

9. That an increase of fifty dollars per annum be made in the salary of Mr. Mortimer Andrus, turnkey at the gao, and that leave be given to introduce a by-law to give effect thereto.

10. That the application of Miss Margaret McHugh, housekeeper at the Court House, for an increase of salary, be not acceded to.
