Something More Yet Called For.

(Weekly Sun, Toronto)
 The Toronto Star expresses the belief that the announcement of the Hon. John Dryden in regard to the adoption of a policy of reafforesting in older Ontario may in time come to be looked upon as the most important step taken in the present generation. The Sun certainly believes that this step, coupled with the action of the Crown Lands Department in setting aside vast areas as permanent forest reserves in New Ontario, is one of the most statesmanlike measures to the credit of the Ontario Government.

The policy outlined should, however, be supplemented by a further step. The Government should insist, as a part of the price paid for a title to a bush lot in Crown Land that a certain amount of clearing shall be done within a given time.

It may be wise to insist upon this in order to prevent the holding of such lands for speculative purposes, but in addition the Government should provide that a portion of each farm shall remain in bush. (See last page) In fact it might be well to specify the parts which may be cleared in order to ensure the intersection of one block of bush by another.
