GENERAL ELECTIONS. Ontario Nominations May 22, Polling Thursday, May 29. FORCES ARRAYED FOR BATTLE. WARREN F. BURTON KILLED. A sea of the late Chief Justice Falls from a C.P.R. train. Hamilton, April 21.—Warren F. Burton, of the law firm of Beice, Burton & Bruce, fell from a C.P.R. train near Brantford Saturday evening and was killed. He was a member of the Public Law Society and a son of the late Chief Justice Burton. The accident occurred when the train was crossing a trestle bridge over the river. Mr. Burton had fallen from the train about 100 feet, going down the ravine over which the trestle bridge passes. He was 52 years of age and leaves a widow and three children.
