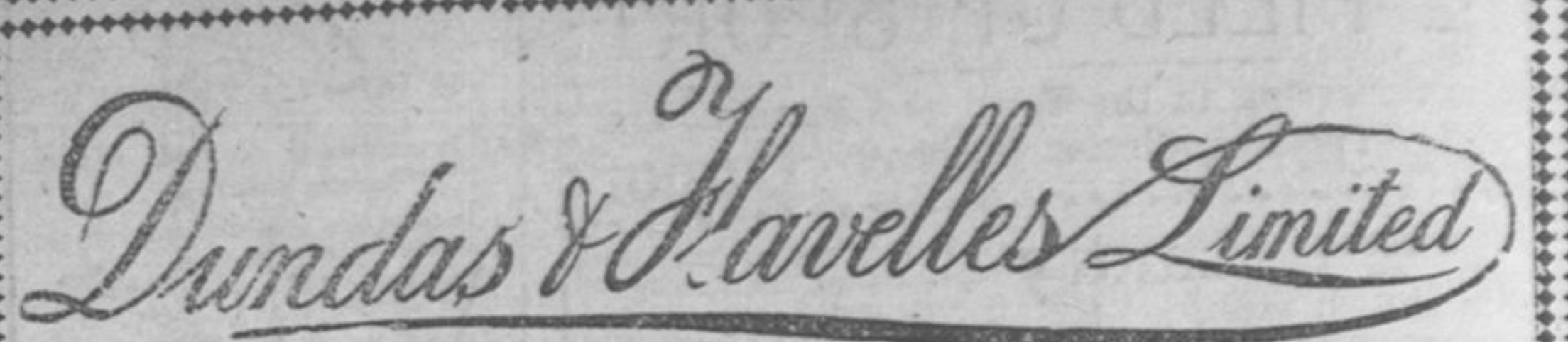

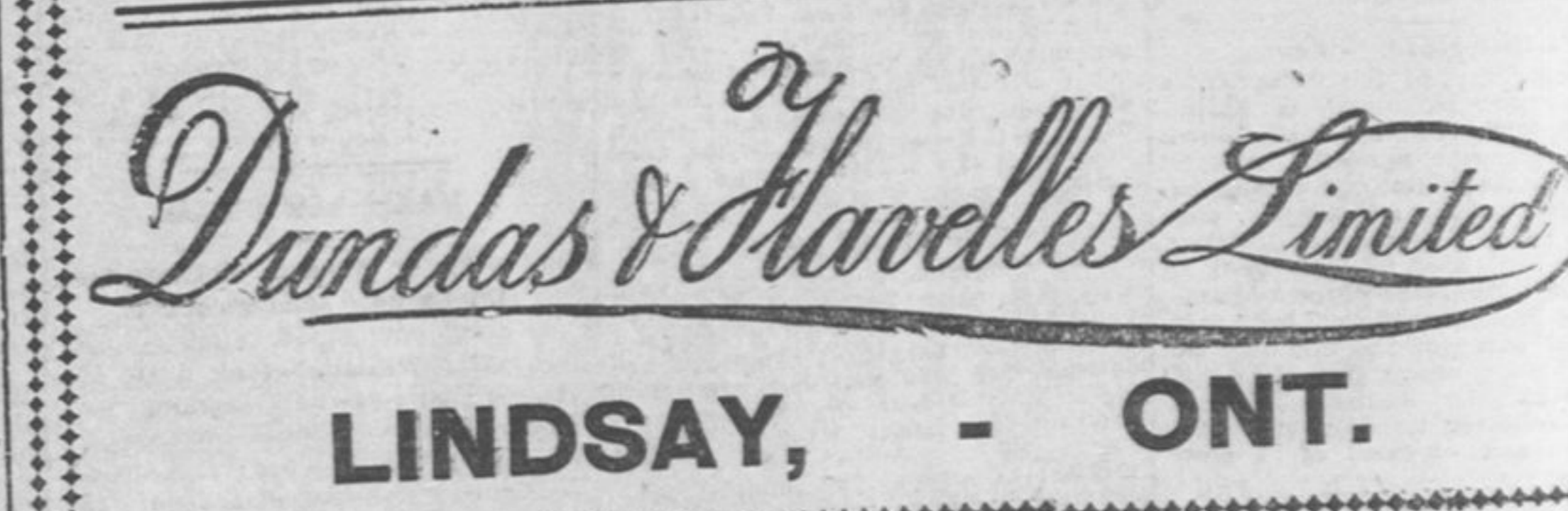

Cart-wheel Shades.

A good substitute for missing shade trees is made as follows: Plant a stout post, nine feet high, where you want the shade, setting the post in two feet of earth; then nail firmly to the top of it, at right angles, two seven-foot strips of two-by-two-inch stuff.

These cart-wheel shades, have blacksmith weld them into a ring, and fasten the ring tightly to the end of the crosspieces. Set a three-year-old grapevine right against the post, coax it to rapid growth, and by the time the shade is down, let the vines down all round it. Seats may be set underneath.—Delinester.

Midland Won't Stay Dry.

In the town of Midland was waged one of the hottest local option fights of the recent campaign, and the law passed by a vote of more than 10 to one, has now been quashed.

The town vote stood 477 to 234, and the town Council was so eager to put the will of the people into law that it passed the final reading of the by-law on the week after the vote, instead of waiting as the statute requires, a clear two weeks between the clerk's finalization of the result, and the passing of the measure.

On this passing of the measure, a dispatch from the Hon. Justice Munk, of Osgoosh, his Lordship holding that the citizens should be given an opportunity to apply for a scrutiny of the vote before the result of the election became operative. This is the intent of the provision requiring the two weeks to elapse. The town had to pay the costs.
