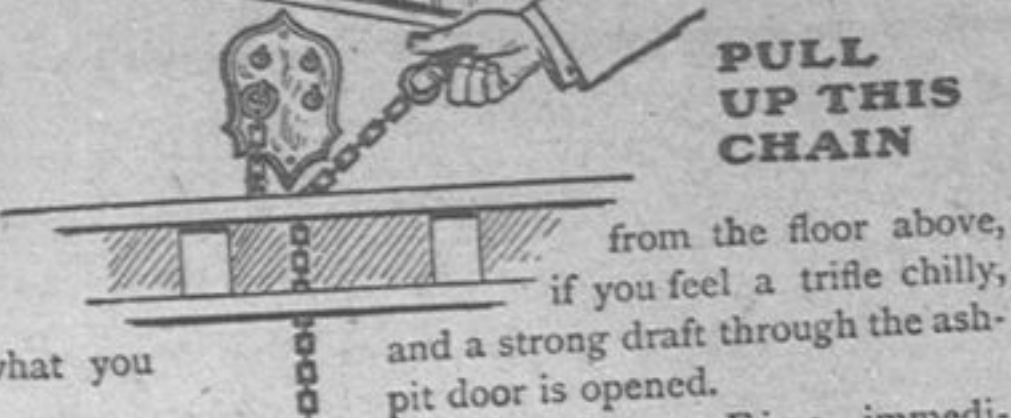

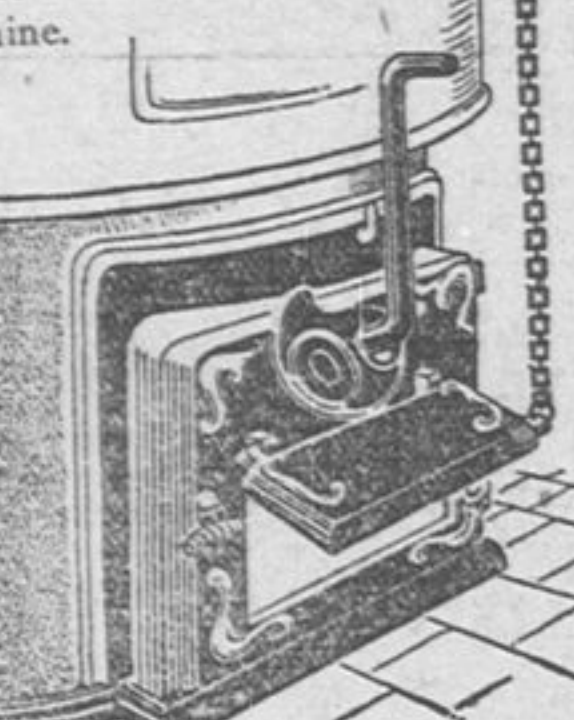

We take from The McMaster University Monthly the following interesting article from the pen of Miss Emma Kennedy, a student, daughter of Mr. Robt. Kennedy, formerly of this town, but now of Toronto. It reads as follows:

Like some night guardian of the silent sky, Stars came out one by one, as if to see How like to paradise the place could be.
