BETTER TELEPHONE CONNECTION.

Evening Post of May 23.
A meeting of the Council of the Board of Trade, we are informed, was held last evening, with Mr. J. O'Reilly in the chair. The principal matter up for discussion, was the poor telephone connection that Lindsay has with outside county points. This was set forth in a letter from Col. Sam Hughes, showing the disadvantages under which Lindsay labored in its present connections. Two of our largest users - Messrs. Sparling and Clemen - were present, and corroborated the Colonel's statement. It seems, for instance, that in order to make connection with Cobocook we have to away round by Uxbridge, and other points are similarly connected. The disadvantage to Lindsay is the loss of time and consequent delays in waiting for connections, the whole thing being very trying to the temper of a busy man.

Mr. Tilley, the Company's local manager, who was present, stated that the Bell people were going to build direct to these points, and were easily waiting for funds to go on with the work. Messrs. Sparling, Clemen and Williams were appointing a committee to confer with the telephone people and see if something could not be done at once.
