In the past year twenty-eight pigs were raised on the Experimental Farm from three sows. They were (arrowed April 1st. From May 1st to September 1st their feed was skim-milk and clover pasture, with but a small quantity of shorts.

The dairy cows on the Experimena lFarm during the last year averaged 5,500 pounds of milk each. The thirteen cows gave 71,500 pounds. From this was removed 3.627 pounds of butter, leaving 67,828 pounds of skim-milk, or over thirty-one tons.

To produce the best cow it is imperative that the call receive the very best of care and attention, and the most important period of calfhood is the first few weeks of its life. During this period the calf is struggling to accustom itself to new surroundings and artificial conditions, and any unnatural treatment at this time will assuredly give it a setback from which it will be slow to recover.

Essex county farmers are greatly discouraged over the outlook for the corn crop. At this time of the year usually the corn is almost ready for cultivation, but this spring except in a few isolated cases, it has not yet appeared above ground. Hundreds of acres planted to corn will be a loss. Flanting will have to be done over late that there will be a scrious danger of their being cagunt by the early fail frosts.


