In the United States the government statistics give the wheat crop at 625,000,000 bushels. It is estimateed that the States will use in domestio coraumption and seed requirements for next year about 500,000,00 bushels. This will Jeave 125,000,000 bushels for export. Of this amount, about 50,000,000 bushels have already been sent out of the country. exports of wheat and flour a week are now averaging over 4,000,000 bushels, so that about eighteen weeks is expected to use up the surplus and leave the country with just bare sope clies for home use.
