A Sweep for McKinley and Roosevelt-"The Full Dinner Pail" Carries the Day-A Big Plurality-At the Homes

> of the Chief Candidates-Roll Call At Mid-

New York, Nov. 6 .- (Midnight.)-It became evident at a very early hour this evening that the election of Mckinley and Roosevelt was assured. At half-past 8 o'clock returns from nearly two-thirds of the election districts of Greater New York had been received, indicating beyond question that Bryan and Stevenson could not expect more than 25,000 or 30,000 plurality in this Democratic stronghold, and unless there was a landside in the outside counties beyond all reasonable expectations the pivotal State of New York had declared in unmistakable terms, altho by a greatly reduced majority, for the Republican candidates. As the night progressed, it only

served to confirm this judgment. Republican Losses and Gains. The returns from Illinois betrayed a like condition. The Republican plurality of 1896 was greatly reduced, but it was still far too large to be overcome. On the other hand, the returns from Indiana, Michigan, the two Dakotas, Utah and Wyoming, as well as Nebraska, seemed to indicate strong Republican gains over 1896. Delaware, Maryland and West Virginia had given decisive Republican pluralities. The count in several of the far western States was naturally so delayed as to give little intimation of the outcome there, but the, had ceased to have a determining effect, and before 10 o'clock the Democratic leaders had given up the contest, and it was announced that Mr. Bryan had gone to bed



Toronto, Nov. 9 .- There were very striking changes caused by the later election returns yesterday. Beginning with the eastern Provinces, there was a gain of a seat by the Libera's in Halifax, Mr. Roche, Liberal, squeezing in with a small majority, and defeating Mr. Kenny, Conservative. As an offset to this Mr. Bell, the colleague of Sir Hibbert Tupper in Pictou, was found to have beer elected by 45. This leaves the Province with 15 Liberals and 5 Conservatives.

In New Brunswick no change is reported, and the Province stands Libera's to 5 Conservatives. In Prince Edward Island there is no change. Four Liberals and one

Conservative. In Quebec there is no change reported, but there are one or two corrections of the election table, leaving the net result unchanged, with 56 Liberals and eight Conservatives, with one presumably Liberal seat,

Gaspe, to be added.

In Ontario there are two changes to the advantage of the Opposition, West Durham and North Bruce. Mr. Beith is besten in Mr. Blake's old constituency by 40, though the Liberals of Bowmanville had celebrated his return on Wednesday evening, and Mr. McNeill is supposed to have been elected by a narrow majority. The returns are not quite final, however, in North Bruce, and the figure is only 17. Fast Simcoe, which was in doubt Wednesday night, goes Conservative by a majority of 82. The scattered and extensive riding of Muskoka and Parry Sound is yet undecided. The candidates have kept very even in the count so far, the Conservatives being 40 ahead with 21 polls out. In Algoma the election takes place on Monday next. In Nipissing also the election is to be held later. This leaves the Province with 35 Government supporters to 52 for the Opposition. Of the three seats unaccounted for, Algoma is practically certain to be added to the Liberal

column. Mr. Dyment's majority in 1896 being nearly 2,000. Nipissing and Muskoka are doubtful. In Manitoba the only seats definitely settled are Winnipeg, Brandon and Lisgar, which remains as announced yesterday. The other four seats are all yet in doubt, with chances favoring the Liberals in at least two of them. Mr. Sifton's majority was rising all day and promises to be in the vicinity of a thousand. The Minister of the Interior was flooded with telegrams of congratulation on his magnificent triumph. In the Territories the result in East Assiniboia is reversed, and Dr. Douglas is re-elected, making the four prairie constituencies solidly Liberal. In British Columbia no change is reported. Two Liberals and two Conservatives are elected, and two constituencies which will probably go Li eral remain to be heard from. Of the 203 constituencies heard from, 127 elect supporters of the

Government, 75 members of the Opposition, giving the Government the ample majority of 52. The ten undetermined ridings not included in these figures will increase the majority to 55 or 56 at least, and possibly higher. The Opposition gained 30 seats and lost 28, making a net gain of two in the 203 contests decided.
