LIBERALS SWEEP THE DOMINION

Government Majority Greater Than in Last Parliament.

MR. R. L. BORDEN GOES DOWN There Are No Tories in His Home Province of Nova Scotia.

FORTY LIBERALS IN ONTARIO Five Conservatives Elected in the Toronto—Mr. Foster Get in By a Narrow Majority—The Quebec Reaction Against Liberalism Did Not Arrive—Clean Sweep in the West.

Table showing election results for Ontario: Ontario 46, Quebec 53, Nova Scotia 18, New Brunswick 8, P. E. Island 1, Manitoba 5, Territories 6, British Columbia 4.

One of the most significant features of the results is the defeat of Mr. Chase Casgrain in Quebec. He it was who inspired the campaign against Laurier because he had granted Great Britain a free trade preference.

Ontario is the least satisfactory spot in the record. The Liberals have pulled down the Conservative majority from sixteen to six, and that is something to be proud of.
