Rev. Dr. McTavish, of Central Presbyterian church, Toronto, (formerly of St. Andrew's, Lindsay), in his sermon last Sunday on "The Victims of Satan," made reference to Miss Anna Eva Fay, whose wonderful feats of assumed reading and divination have astonished thousands night after night through the past few months.
