NEW MEXICO'S DRY CLIMATE

ONE OF THE FINEST IN THE WORLD FOR TUBERCULOUS PATIENTS

Why it is Superior to Southern Colorado and Other Popular Resorts.

We feel assured that many of our readers in town and country, and especially the medical profession, will be much interested in the following article on "Climatic Treatment of Tuberculosis in New Mexico," from the pen of Mr. A. L. McCallum, M.D., of the U.S. Army, who has spent a number of years in that country.

Albuquerque, N. M., Nov. 24. (To the Editor of the Post.)

If it does not infringe too much on your valuable space, this short article may include some worthy matter for consideration for some of your many readers. Over five years ago I sent a couple of articles to your paper on "Central New Mexico," and "Southern Colorado." These were first impressions, and as such may have contained a number of mistakes. However, after a lapse of nearly six years, and after observation, coupled with an earnest desire to get at the exact and most thorough, comprehensive survey of the facts, setting aside all preconceived ideas and notions, ought to render the statements made below worthy of the earnest consideration of those to whom they may be of interest.

Tuberculosis, or the "White Plague," as it is more frequently called, has become a subject of international importance. Rich and poor, old and young, alike are subject to it, and unfortunately it finds most of its victims among the younger generations. Statistics show an alarming state of mortality due to this disease. It is true that Canada is not so badly afflicted in this regard as the Northern and Central States, but throughout America and Europe it is practically a universal plague. We are horrified at the great slaughter going on in the East, where all that vicious hatred and reckless courage can accomplish is being done to push the combatants into an unrelenting grave. But the numbers there slain are small compared with the hosts that are silently swept away by the "White Plague." Hence, the most important and preventive has become a matter of international importance.

Some years ago a select body of physicians of different nationalities made an exhaustive search through all favorable climates for a location which could be proven to be the most beneficial climatic sanatorium for the cure of Tuberculosis.

They found two localities thoroughly adapted for this purpose. These were certain parts of the northern region of Africa between the Sahara desert and the coast, and the valley of the river Congo (Congo River) the most favorable portion of which, two hundred miles long, lies within the territory of New Mexico. These researchers, who were objective in this regard, conducted where without regard to any national preference or prejudice.

What were the characteristics of these two regions which caused the selection? Simply, in that they were favored in the highest degree with those features of climate, which have been sufficiently proven to be the most beneficial and effective in healing long trouble of all kinds. What are those features of climate? It were waste of time to go into details, but the first essential we will touch on is Constant Sunshine. It will not do to have sunshine once a week; its rays must be present every day, and its intensity is of great importance. It is destructive to noxious germ life, and it is essential in climatic treatment to a recovery from tuberculosis, if not in all, at least in a number of cases, while it is most certainly advantageous in every single case without exception.

The second great requisite is Fresh Air. This is more universal than sunshine, and it is more essential in climatic treatment. There are many recommendations, and much difference in opinion as to efficacy of different treatments for tuberculosis, but whether they live north or south, whether they be enthusiasts or otherwise, it will be found that physicians insist on the fresh air element as an absolute essential to cure any disease which is chronic. From its very nature will not yield to spasmodic efforts. Many people are very unreasonable in this regard, and they realize that he has a disease, must eventually Destroy Him.

If he does not fight it tooth and nail, it is a great mistake that one has the disease. But it is a fact. Do you, then, think that a well-established chronic disease will yield to feeble efforts to a few months' treatment, or to a few bottles of some patent nostrum? If you do, in some cases out of every ten you expect too much. As a chronic disease invades the system gradually, its symptoms become more aggravated; it is checked; it is only reasonable to conclude that it can be completely banished only by a permanent renovation of the system brought about by persistent effort, made up of a judicious combination of all the most approved hygienic methods accompanied by proper nourishment and a complete abandonment of all causes, whether predisposing or exciting, which may in any way favor the advance of the disease. Switchboards in this regard must be above all others—fidelity, perseverance and endurance. Since fresh air is an essential to cure, it is quite evident that it is practically an immense advantage to live in a climate where one can obtain this requisite by living outside constantly, without having to risk other conditions of disadvantages. The patient can do this in the territory of New Mexico.

This naturally leads us to what I consider to be the rough, "the trump card" in the treatment of tuberculosis, and that is the fresh air element. I know, come into conflict with the opinions of many physicians, who claim to be curing many cases of tuberculosis in mountain sanatoriums in New York and in other States. This I believe, is true, and I hope the cases are permanent. I am talking to a physician once on the subject. He said, "Provided you stay out in the fresh air constantly, the eastern and northern climates will not be very detrimental." When I asked him if it were not true that dampness was favorable to the
