

The Public Health Act requires that parents should present the child within three months after birth for vaccination to the officers appointed by the municipality or to a registered medical practitioner, or to the hospital authorities. It further provides that in the eighth dan thereafter the child shall be brought, again to the doctor so as to permit of verification of the vaccination,

Another section of the Act requires the physician to perform the vaccination and to give a certificate to send a duplicate to the clerk of
