The city has brought back all landfill and transit services, is working on having all libraries open in limited capacity by the end of the month, and has two ice pads and four arena halls up and running. Now, City Hall has opened more ice pads, service centres and is opening Logie Street Park.

Emily/Omemee ice pad opened Sept. 8 followed closely by ice pads at Fenelon Falls and Little Britian Sept. 14. The city is preparing to open ice pads in Manvers and Woodville in October, but is still assessing demand.

Cobconk Service Centre opened Sept. 8 and the Omemee Service Centre will open Sept. 28.

Logie Street Park will officially open Sept 21. It's too late in the year for the splash pad to open, but the city is considering opening an ice trail at the park this winter depending on the weather.

Ron Taylor, chief administrative officer, said the city was looking at getting back to regular business where it "made sense."

Cash handling is back with most city services except landfills. City administration buildings remain closed to the general public. The city is also considering byappointment public access.
